URGE BUILDING ROAD AT ONCE

Cost of Construction to Port Edward It is Thought Would Not Be Excessive.

The Council of the Board of Trade last night decided to again request the Provincial Government to commence construction of a road from Prince Rupert to Port Edward with a view to continuing it up the river to the canneries. It was estimated that the cost of such a road from the city limits near Shawatlans, including a bridge connecting Kaien Island with the mainland, would be approximately \$60,000. This road would open up a lot of good level land suitable for industrial sites and would be a great boon to the city. It would primarily be a commercial road but also would serve as an outlet for the residents here on pleasure bent.

A committee has the matter in hand to draft a resolution to be forwarded to the minister of lands immediately.

There is already a survey of this section of the island in existence and this may be utilized for the road.

GRAND CONCERT BY CHORAL CLUB

Miles of Good Surface There, say Engineering Staff From Power House.

The ice on Shawatlans Lake is first rate for skating. R. L. Forse who is in charge of the power house, reports that yesterday a number of members of the staff at that place skated from end to end of the lake and found the ice excellent. The only weak spots were at the upper end where the streams flow into the lake. He says it would be quite safe for a party to skate there in the evening. The roughest ice is at the lower end near the outlet. Not a hole or crack was found anywhere until at least three-quarters of the distance up the lake.
