Four Chinese Appeals and Various Civil Actions for Judge Young

County Court opens before Judge F. McR. Young on February 7 and the following cases are set down:

Peter Byrne vs. J. Hilditch, \$190 damage as result of collision between boats Tide and Dolphin. Williams, Manson & Gonzales for the plaintiff and Fisher & Oughton for the defence.

DETAILS JAPANESE SUICIDE ARE HERE

Tama Kameda was Thirty-five Years of Age and Sister of Essington Merchant

Details of the Japanese suicide case at Port Essington on Sunday have reached the local provincial police office from Constable Gibson at Essington.

The nine of the dead woman was Tama Kameda and she was the sister of H. Kameda, a Port Essington merchant. She was 35 years of age and had been in Essington for three years. (Of late she had been acting in a peculiar manner for no apparent reason and when she was missed for a few minutes on Sunday evening about 5.30 a search was made and the tragedy discovered. She evidently had drunk carbolic acid or lye and had hung herself with a rope from the rafters in an empty house. She was found hanging from the rope, having kicked a stool on which she stood from underneath. A letter in Japanese was found in her pocket as was also a package of acid.

Inquiry Held.
The remains of the dead woman reached here last night in charge of Constable R. Gibson and Corporal McMullin decided this morning at an inquiry that the case was simply one of suicide.

The following is the translation of the letter found on her person after death as translated by C. S. Ohnaka, secretary of the Prince Rupert Japanese Association: "I wrote a letter to Japan. I have done everything. I was not able to satisfy to everybody and wish to excuse me. I will be await parents at another world."

SCHOOL TEACHERS

TALK OF STRIKING AT CHARLOTTETOWN

CHARLOTTETOWN, P.E.I., Jan. 27.—That the staff of the Prince of Wales College and Normal School who went on strike last autumn for higher salaries and returned to their positions on the promise of the Provincial Government that the matter of increases would be given favorable consideration, are still dissatisfied and may "walk-out" again, is the substance of a persistent rumor. The faculty are keeping their own counsel, but interesting developments are expected at any time.

The pedagogical strike took place while the teachers were in receipt of the following stipends:

- Dr. N. S. Robertson, Principal \$2,100
- G. S. Steele, Vice-Principal, \$1,700
- E. Blanchard \$1,400
- J. G. Bennett \$1,300
- Miss R. McGrath \$1,150
- Miss L. Seaman \$1,200
- J. P. Smith \$1,200

After the college had been closed for several days and the staff withdrew its resignations as a body and went back to work, increases of \$300 were given to the Principal and the Vice-Principal; another member of the staff had his salary increased \$400, another \$250 and the remaining two each received a \$200 increase.

These additions to their salaries did not meet the full demands of the teachers who are asking \$2,500 a year for the principal, \$2,200 for the vice-principal, and a further increase of \$200 for the rest of the staff.
