## NURSES' HOME TO BE DELAYED

Directors of Hospital Discuss Finances With the Member For This District.

The building of the nurses' home will have to stand over for the present year. This was the decision of the hospital board at its meeting yesterday afternoon. An effort will be made, however, to proceed with the work of shingling the building, of putting in steam heat in the operating room and operating tables, of fitting up a laboratory and purchasing a new X-ray machine.

Hon. T. D. Pattullo was present at the meeting and Chairman Stewart outlined the needs of the hospital, especially of the nurses' home. He said that the building of a nurses' home meant really increasing the capacity of the hospital.

**Contrary to Policy.**  
 Mr. Pattullo said he had hoped to get a grant for the home but he found that it has not been the policy of the Government to make grants for this purpose. There was a small sum of \$35,000 in the estimates for special grants to hospitals throughout the province and a grant from this sum might be obtained for other purposes.

The matter of finances was a difficult one with the Government Mr. Pattullo said. They had been borrowing a lot of money and this year they were proposing to borrow about fifteen million dollars. This policy could not continue. He thought, however, the peak had been reached and they would not need as much next year. He advised that they wait until they found out how much was likely to be obtained from the sale of liquor, the city's share of which had been earmarked for hospitals and schools. He suggested that they send in a claim for consideration and, on his arrival in Victoria, Mr.

## LIKELY TO BEGIN ROAD TO SKEENA

Member to Take It up With the Government on His Return to Victoria.

A committee of the Board of Trade consisting of George Tate, T. H. Johnson and H. F. Pullen, along with Mayor Rochester and Alderman Parker, met Hon. T. D. Pattullo yesterday afternoon and discussed with him the possibility of securing a grant this year toward the building of the road from the city limits in the direction of the Skeena River canneries by way of Galloway Rapids.

It was explained that the members of the City Council at a recent meeting all expressed themselves in favor of building the part of the road inside the city along Frederick Street to Prince Rupert Boulevard, following the pipeline, and from there to Shawatlans road at the city limits. This would make connection with the government road.

**Keen as Anyone.**  
 Mr. Pattullo said he was very familiar with conditions and with the need for the road and he was just as keen as anyone on trying to get it constructed. It was only a matter of dollars and cents. There was an appropriation for roads which could be used if the bonds could be sold and some of the amounts could very likely be secured to build this particular road. They could depend on him doing his utmost to secure it. He advised that the council pass a resolution pledging themselves to bring in a bylaw to proceed with their end of the work and send this to Victoria. If he could get the appropriation they could then proceed with their bylaw and the construction of the city end of the work and the government with theirs.

**Special Reason.**  
 Mr. Pattullo said he fully agreed that the road should be built, especially in view of the fact that the auto licenses were collected here every year by the Provincial Government.
