PRAIRIE RAIN BENEFICIAL

Threatened Lack of Moisture Averted by General Precipitation Last Week

WINNIPEG, May 16.—During the week just past there have been rains almost everywhere on the prairies and the results have been most beneficial to the growing crops and especially to the late seed.

Reports from various points in the two provinces indicate that the rainfall has been general. It is estimated that between 65 and 70 per cent of the wheat acreage of western Canada is planted, and while but few districts have suffered from lack of moisture yet the benefits of a soaking rain, at this period in seeding operations will be very great.

In Alberta, where wheat seeding is practically complete, the weather has been reported cloudy, but little rain fell.

Sections of farm land in the vicinity of Regina and Swift Current, which suffered last week from high winds, causing drifting and the blowing out of seed will be assisted materially by the rain.

The rains followed a period of fine, warm weather which has brought vegetation along rapidly. The fall was heaviest in central Manitoba.

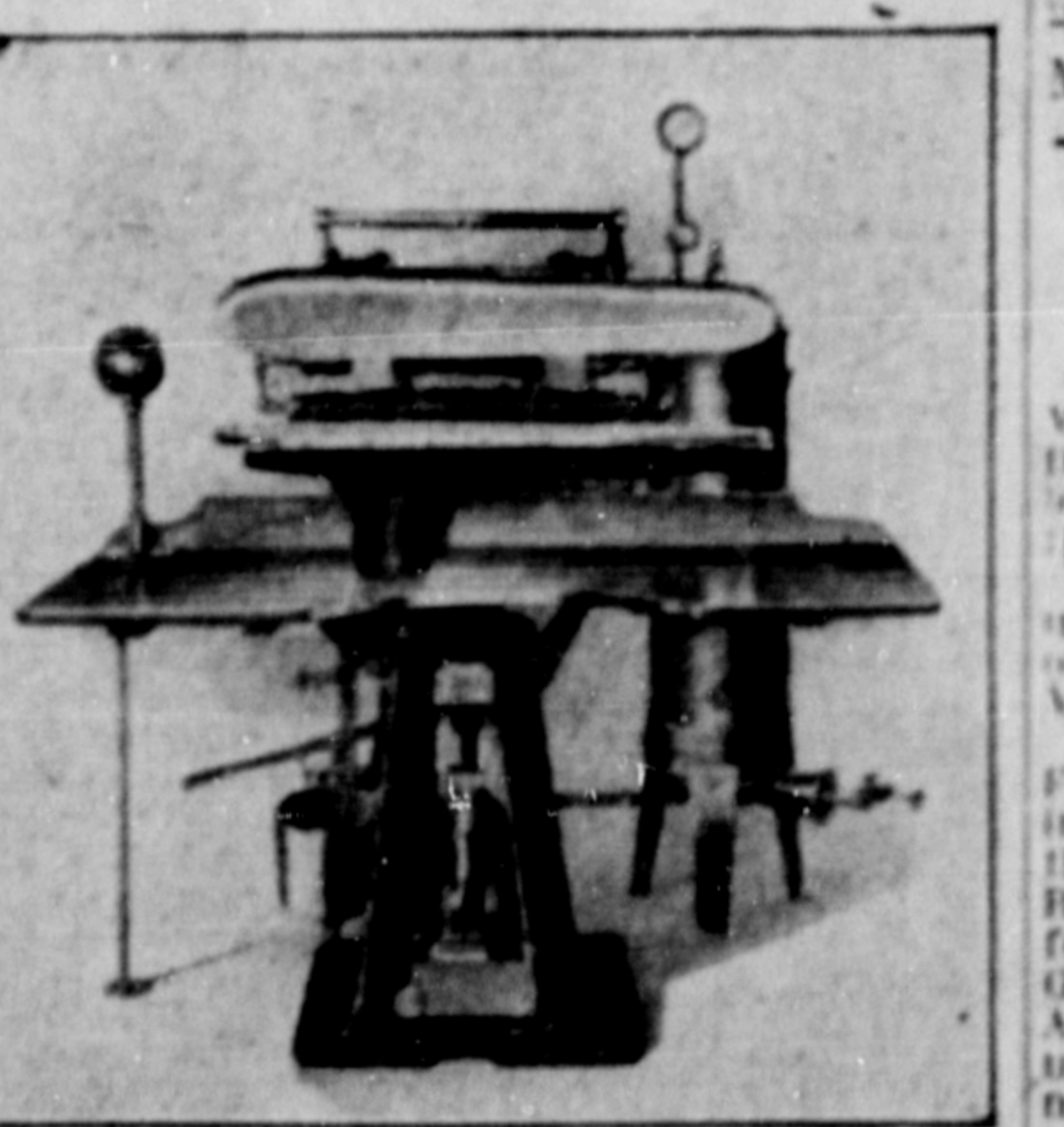

CHEAP ASPHALT AT FORT MCMURRAY FOR PAVING ALL CITIES

EDMONTON, May 16.—"We are going to turn out asphalt and paving material so cheap that it will be within the bounds of every city, village and hamlet in the western provinces to pave their streets with the products of the great paving resources of the Fort McMurray fields." Such was the announcement made by Colonel J. K. Cornwall, of Edmonton, made by him to the Bulletin shortly after his arrival in this city from a visit to San Francisco capitalists.

Colonel Cornwall is one of the chiefs of the San Francisco and Fort McMurray Oil Refining Company, a company of strong financial backing whose aim is to immediately develop the tar and oil sands of the Fort McMurray district in order to put the products of these fields on the market of western Canada and the east.

Big Centre for Paving

"We are going to make McMurray one of the biggest centres of the paving industry on the American continent," enthusiastically continued Colonel Cornwall, "and we are going to start with Edmonton first. The proposal which we will lay before this city here will be such that full consideration will have to be given to the opportunities we will offer. There will be no reason in the world why Edmonton will not be able to go ahead, and commence paving every street in the city with the paving products that will be brought here from our great natural resources at McMurray."

On account of the deplorable condition of roads in this district, the Prince George Board of Trade recently passed a resolution urging upon the provincial government that henceforward all roads be built on the contract plan. It was considered that the day labor system was at once expensive and inefficient.

The estimates for civic improvements this year have been adopted by the council. They are divided as follows: Board of works, \$20,000; street grading, \$12,000; sidewalks, \$8,000; fire, water and light, \$19,000; electric light extensions, \$5,000, and water works extensions, \$14,000.

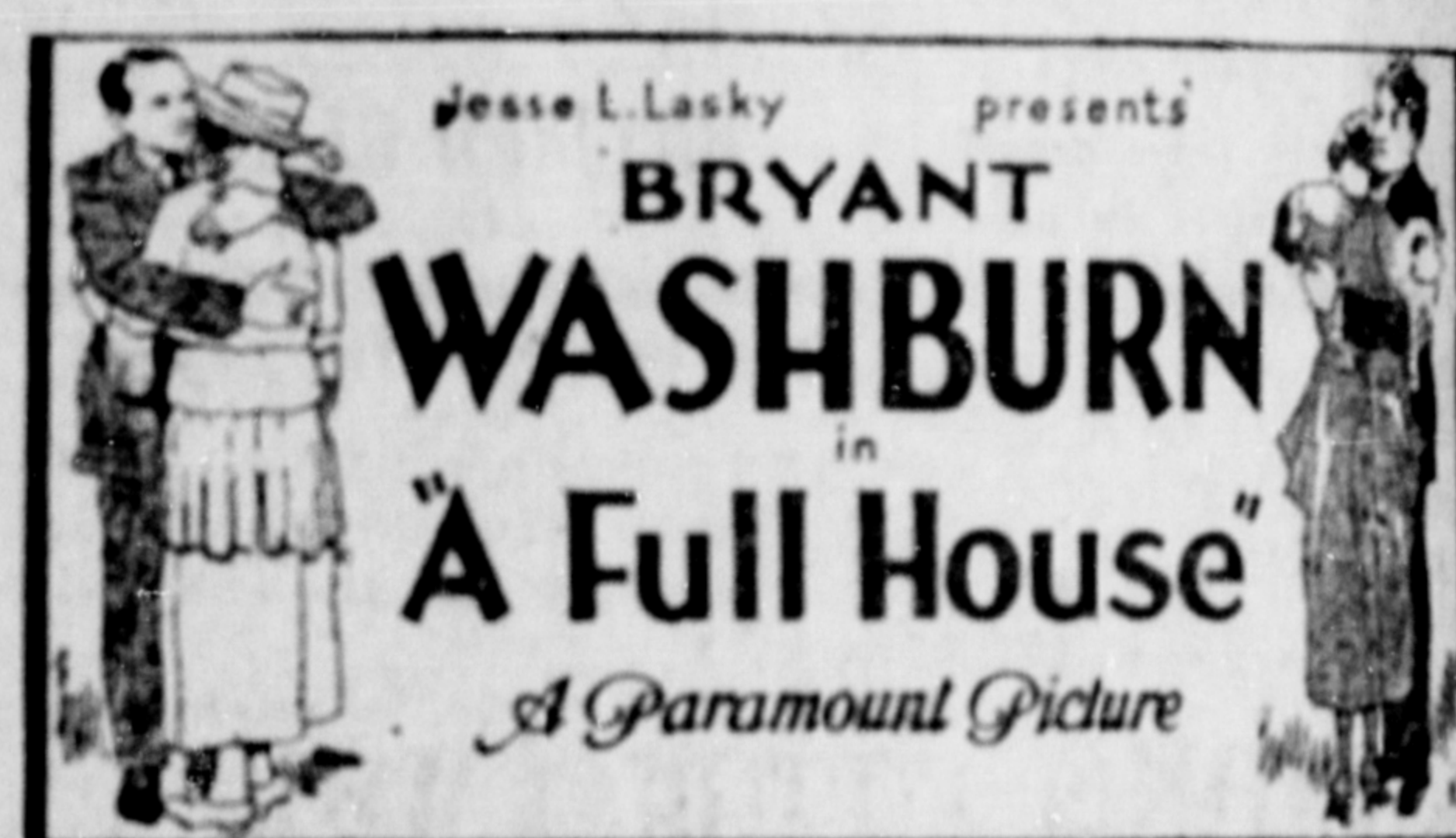
