**NEW TARIFF LAW
MAKES PRICES IN
STATES MUCH HIGHER**

NEW YORK, June 23.—(By Canadian Press).—Effects of the emergency tariff law are already being felt by United States consumers. Food experts trace the recent advance of pork and beef prices to the new rates imposed on meats coming across the Canadian border.

The Emergency Tariff Law has been in effect but a short time and while live steers and hogs are lower there is an advance of fully 2 cents in the wholesale price per pound of dressed Western steers and pork loins.

Under the new tariff smoked meats and provisions arriving here from Canada are subject to excessive import duty. It is expected that some of this may be refunded to dealers later. In the meantime the consumer will have to pay and will not receive any later rebate.

**RAILROADERS WILL
RESIST REDUCTION OF
WAGES AS ANNOUNCED**

WINNIPEG, June 22.—Although practically all the heads of the railway labor organizations in Winnipeg are absent in the east on the wage conference, those remaining in the city expressed the opinion that a 12 per cent cut in wages would be resisted. Harry Kempster, business agent for the machinists, said that the men would not accept such a reduction. The railwaymen protest on the grounds that the cost of living in Canada does not warrant any reduction irrespective of the situation in the United States. While it is stated that the decrease would apply on July 1 to all railway employees throughout Canada, numbering approximately 150,000, W. F. Dark, assistant-general chairman of the maintenance-of-way-men, said that the national agreement for this organization did not expire until July 15, whereas other railroad organizations were given notice thirty days earlier.

**MEASURE CHILD TO
DETERMINE WHETHER
IT SHALL RIDE FREE**

PHILADELPHIA, June 22.—Children in Philadelphia will in future ride free or pay full fare, according to height and not age. Boys and girls 34 inches or less in height ride free and at the side of the conductor is a painted line accurately measured which settles all disputes.

If the conductor is at all in doubt he asks the parent to place the child against the wall. Of course the baby's hat is removed and his hair flattened down against the head. Thirty-one inches is the minimum height given by authorities for children at the age of three. There are numerous instances of two-year-olds surpassing that height and of six-year-olds failing to reach it.
