Pattullo Finds No Sentiment Of Substance Favoring Union; General Tone Is Much Better

MERRITT, Sept. 10:-T. D. Pattullo, provincial Liberal leader, completed a tour of the interior and returned from here to Victoria last night. During an address here just before leaving, Mr. Pattullo declared that he had this year found a very much more settled and healthier opinion as to general economic conditions than seemed evident the previous year. Beyond all doubt, he said, conditions were improving and, in this connection, public temperament was a vital factor.
