TRADES AND LABOR COUNCIL AND LOWER UTILITIES CHARGES

Alderman Dybhavn Replies Rather Strongly to Letter Condemning Attitude Council

A letter from the Trades and Labor Council protesting the example of business that had been shown when the city council had shelved the Rates Bylaw providing lower light and telephone rates, was received last night and filed. The city clerk was ordered to reply to the letter informing the Trades and Labor Council that the matter was still under advisement. Automatically it will come up again at next week's council meeting.
The letter caused further discussion on the bylaw that had been brought in by the Utilities Committee some weeks ago providing for lower rates.
Dybhavn Explains
"I have no apologies to offer for my stand on the matter," said Alderman Dybhavn, chairman of the Finance Committee. "It looks nice to refer to a \$30,000 surplus in the Utilities department, but up to and including last year the main burden of the light and water departments was carried by the taxpayers of the city as far as capital expenditure and redemption is concerned. I am not prepared to admit that the Trades Council knows more about the business of the light department than the aldermen do, and I do not take such a resolution seriously although it may have arisen out of the best intentions. If the overhead of the light department that is being paid out of general revenue were transferred to it there would be but a small margin of profit at the end of the year. As far as the comparison with rates in other cities is concerned, they are misleading."
It was pointed out by Alderman Kelly that the bylaw was not held over indefinitely, but was to come up after May 1.
