The hat was thrown on the express car of a train in New York some months ago and has since been travelling hither and thither throughout the United States and Canada over devious routes and remote places. It is now on its way back to New York, and will be in Prince Rupert a few days.

The hat, which is just a plain old black felt slouch one, bears no less than 37 souvenir cards of various places it has visited, among them being Marshfield, Wis., Chicago, Kankakee, Edmon-ton, Vancouver, Philadelphia, Westside, N. Y., Saskatoon, Regina, Ocean Falls, Brandon, Winnipeg, Ont., Fort Francis, Ont., Hope, B. C., Denver, Kansas City, San Francisco and Duluth.

### M. P. P. PARSON MAY NOT RESIGN

Rev. Thomas Menzies Will Probably Continue to Have Charge of Church.

VICTORIA, March 22.—Rev. Thomas Menzies, M. P. P., Comox, will probably not resign from the Presbyterian Presbytery if the wishes of the district in which he has been serving are taken into consideration.

At the meeting of the Presbytery here Monday night a letter from Mr. Menzies was read offering to resign his charge if a union of his district with Courtenay could be effected.

Dr. Campbell reported on his visit to the district when a congregational meeting was held, and by a substantial majority a resolution was carried to the effect that the Presbytery be requested to refuse to accept Mr. Menzies's resignation. After a lengthy discussion it was decided to leave the matter as at present, and it will be dealt with at the Synod meeting in May.

### KILLED EIGHT SINN FEINERS IN AMBUSH AND WOUNDED TWENTY

DUBLIN, March 23.—A police inspector and eight men were ambushed near Dingle yesterday. The fight lasted for three hours, during which time eight of the attacking party were killed and twenty wounded. Three of the police were slightly wounded.

### NO FREE PASSAGES WITHOUT CONSENT

LONDON, March 23.—No free passages are to be issued by the overseas settlement committee to the Dominions without the approval of representatives of the Dominions. It was stated in the House of Commons today by the colonial secretary, Colonel Avery.
