King Can Do No Wrong Officially. Under the constitutional government of Great Britain as it has worked out in past years the King in his official acts can do no wrong because he always acts on the advice of his constitutional advisers and if the action is wrong it is the fault of the adviser who is responsible to the people and not the fault of the King.

Because of the peculiar position taken by the sovereigns, all criticisms in regard to government are levelled at the Prime Minister and his colleagues, and if the people are dissatisfied it is the cabinet that resigns and not the King. The kings and queens have generally been very careful to avoid personal criticism.

When a Prime Minister resigns he advises the sovereign as to what man shall be chosen to succeed him, usually the leader of the largest opposition group in Parliament. On one occasion Queen Victoria, after the resignation of Lord Disraeli as Prime Minister, delayed sending for Mr. Gladstone, and it was a week later before that great leader got the message asking him to form a cabinet.

British Constitution Grown, Not Made. The British constitution has never been written. It was never formulated; it just grew. It is the development of centuries. On it many modern governmental constitutions have been based, but they are written and are therefore rigid.

There are people who would throw away all this experience of the past. They would throw it off just as we discard a worn-out shirt. In its place they would take a new style of garment which has never been tried and which is not adapted to the peculiar needs of a British people.

CAPT. MOOREHOUSE BOOSTS FOR NORTH

Skipper of Prince George Tells People to South of Doings Here.

Captain Moorehouse is an optimist when it comes to talking about the North. He has been telling the people at the provincial capital what we are doing. An interview with him published in a Victoria paper says: "A breath of optimism and cheerful outlook of the northlands was brought by Captain Moorehouse today when the G. T. P. steamer Prince George docked here on her scheduled run from Prince Rupert and Stewart, B. C.

"At Prince Rupert the 1000-foot government dock is now being fitted with a brand new shed, the work to cost in the neighborhood of \$39,000 alone for labor, exclusive of materials to complete. The new sheds are creating plenty of work for the overflow of the unemployed in that city, and nearly all are now at work in some capacity or another. The new dock when completed will be an important new ocean terminal at that point.

"At Stewart the Premier Mining Company is now erecting the second largest aerial tramway in the world. The longest one is in the Southern States, it is asserted. The new aerial tramway is an extensive work and is giving employment to a large number, while in the mines alone some 450 men are on the payroll. Stewart is booming to some extent as the result of the employment there and the good wages paid."

Ten Years Ago in Prince Rupert

COMOX FARMER WAS ATTACKED BY BULL SEVERELY INJURED

COURTNEY, Aug. 1.—Whilst working in his yard at his farm at Minto on Wednesday morning about nine o'clock a young Jersey bull suddenly turned on Mr. Tom Pearce and threw him down and mauling him badly before the arrival of help in the person of Mr. Nehemiah Harvey who happened to be passing at the time.

Mr. Pearce lies in a serious condition at his home, several ribs have been broken and his head and body have been badly bruised. It is hoped that no internal injuries have been sustained. Mr. Pearce was unconscious for some hours after he was rescued and cannot now give a clear account of what happened. Mr. Harvey says that he was passing on the road when he saw Mr. Pearce lying on the ground near the mower. He thought he was looking at the machinery until he saw a young bull make a rush at the prostrate man.

Mr. Harvey then came to the rescue with a club and attempted to beat the bull off while he rescued Mr. Pearce from further attacks. The infuriated animal could not be restrained with a club and Mr. Harvey worked round until he could get hold of a fork which was lying near and he then effectually drove off the bull. He called for help to carry Mr. Pearce in and Mrs. and Miss Pearce came out and all three turned their efforts to carrying Mr. Pearce into the house. The bull then attacked all three and knocked Miss Pearce down without seriously injuring her, fortunately. The bull was beaten off again and Mr. Pearce borne into the house and Dr. McNaughton at once sent for from Cumberland.

CANCELLATION OF RESERVE.
