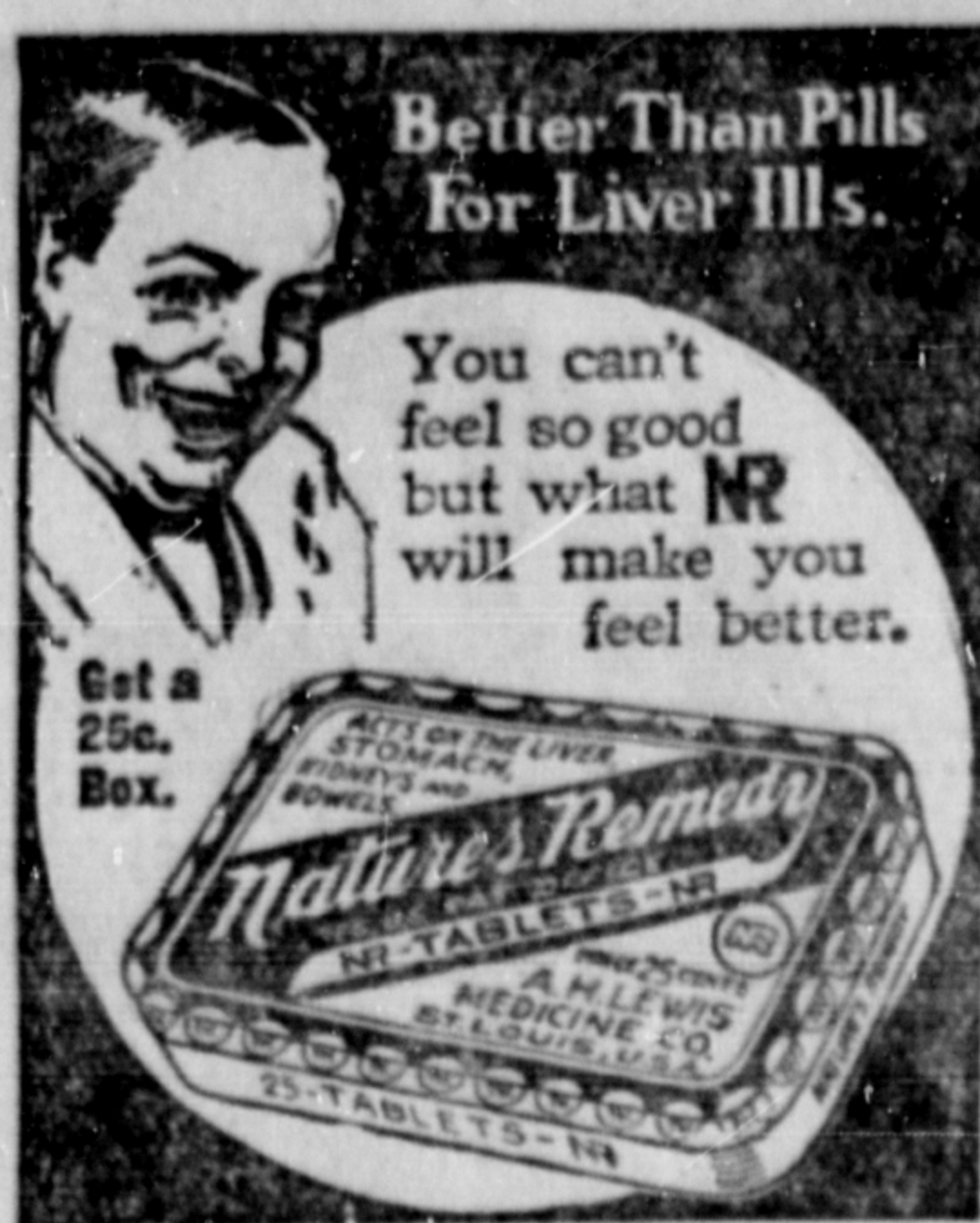

## Synopsis of Land Act Amendments

Minimum price of first-class land reduced to \$5 an acre; second-class to \$1.50 an acre.

Pre-emption now confined to surveyed lands only.

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land.

Records without permanent residence may be issued, provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$100 per annum and records same each year.

Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture.

Title cannot be obtained in less than 5 years, and improvements of \$10.00 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence of at least 2 years are required.

Pre-emptor holding Crown grant may record another pre-emption, if he registers land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homestead; title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions.

For grazing and industrial purposes areas exceeding 50 acres may be leased by one person or company.

Mills, factory or industrial sites on timber land not exceeding 100 acres may be purchased; conditions include payment of stumpage.

Natural hay meadows inaccessible by existing roads may be purchased conditional upon construction of a road to them. Rehears of one-half of cost of road, not exceeding half of purchase price, is made.

PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS ACT.

The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons holding and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The time within which the heirs or devisees of a deceased pre-emptor may apply for title under this Act is extended from one year from the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the present war. This privilege is also made retroactive.

No fees relating to pre-emptors are due or payable by soldiers on pre-emptions recorded after June 26, 1918.

Taxes are remitted for five years after return of money advanced, due and been paid since August 4, 1914, on account of payments, fees or taxes on soldiers' pre-emptions.

Interest on agreements to purchase town or city lots held by members of Allied Forces, or dependents, acquired direct or indirect, remitted from enactment to March 31, 1920.

SUB-PURCHASERS OF CROWN LANDS.

Provision made for issuance of Crown Grants to sub-purchasers of Crown lands, acquiring rights from purchasers who have obtained Crown purchase, involving forfeiture, on fulfillment of conditions of purchase, interest and taxes. Where sub-purchaser does not claim whole of original parcel, purchase price due and taxes may be distributed proportionately over whole area. Applications must be made by May 1, 1920.

GRAZING.

Grazing Act, 1919, for systematic development of livestock industry provides for grazing districts and range administration under Commissioner.

Annual grazing permits issued based on numbers ranged; priority for established owners. Stock-owners may form Associations for range management. Free, or partially free, permits for soldiers' camps or travellers, up to ten head.

## HOME RULE IN WEST AFRICA

Mission to England in Connection with Extensions of Local Government

LONDON, Jan. 20. — West Africa is the latest country to seek home rule. A mission, representative of educated opinion in British West Africa, has arrived here to urge upon the Colonial office a number of reforms in the internal administration of the four West African colonies and protectorates, Sierra Leone, the Gold Coast, Nigeria and the Gambia.

The Mission has been sent to this country by the National Congress of British West Africa, and seeks in the first place the creation of a legislative council which will be composed one half of members chosen by the crown and one half of members elected by the people, and for a house of assembly which would have complete control of the revenue and expenditure.

As to local government, the mission urges that local corporations should be established in each of the principal towns of the colonies.

## Judicial System

The judicial system of British West Africa, in particular Nigeria, is criticized by the mission which states that at present "it is the practice to appoint to judicial office Europeans who have not received any legal training and who are not competent to exercise judicial functions."

Among other suggested reforms they seek the establishment of a West African University; the removal of the color bar in the West African medical service and the introduction of immigration laws to prevent the influx of undesirable aliens to British West Africa.
