**Fishing Season
Beginning Soon.**

While there has been some fishing here all winter, the larger boats bringing in catches with more or less regularity, the smaller boats are now again going into commission and the more daring skippers have already made for the Queen Charlottes where they expect to find halibut on the banks.

While it will be some time before halibut is coming in large quantities, it is well to make preparations. So far, none of the new ears ordered last summer by the Canadian National Railway have appeared here. We have been told that eighty are ordered, but until they arrive they do not benefit Prince Rupert or the railway. It is to be hoped for the sake of the fishermen, the city and the railway that this much-needed provision will be made so that the business may be kept in Canada instead of being sent away to Seattle.

**British Boxers
Beat the Yanks.**

It is curious that American professional boxers usually beat the British but British amateurs hold their own well. The record reported yesterday when four English boys won out at New York against four crack American amateurs, was one to be proud of. Howard Stutchbury, trade commissioner for Alberta, is again in the city in connection with the erection of coal bunkers. He is determined to go ahead with the scheme. Alberta wants to ship coal from this coast and they are going to do it. That is the way to talk business.

A. E. Warren, general manager of the Canadian National Western lines is in full accord with Mr. Stutchbury's ideas in regard to this matter. He is anxious for business for the road and he has promised that the bunkers will be built at once. The plans will have to come before the board of directors of the company and as soon as approved it is the understanding that the work will commence.

FOR HERRING**Frederia in Charge of Capt. Skog
Will Leave Soon as Fish
Sighted.

Local fishermen are now waiting for the arrival of the herring. So far they are not reported in this neighbourhood although they are said to have arrived at Skagway and also have been noticed a long way south of here.

The Canadian Fish and Gold Storage Co. is preparing to put away from 1,000 to 1,500 tons of herring this year, sufficient to supply the anticipated extra demand, which should result from the provision of sufficient refrigerator cars to handle the business.

The fishing boat Frederia is all ready for the work. She will be in charge of Ole Skog, one of the finest seamen on the coast. The scows and tenders are also awaiting action. All have been overhauled and are ready for business.

There is a certain amount of scouting going on in anticipation of the fish coming this way, the boats going as far south as Banks Island. Sometimes, however, the herring are first seen in the neighborhood of Port Simpson.

The table given is for Port Simpson but the time for Prince Rupert varies only a few minutes on some days and on others is the same. The range of the tide may be computed as 5 per cent greater at Prince Rupert than at Port Simpson both at springs and neaps. Therefore the rise in the Prince Rupert harbor is slightly greater than Port Simpson.

The height is in feet and tenths of feet above the average level of lower low water.
