Sixty Dollars a Month with Board Being Paid in Eastern Province.

ST. JOHN, N.B., Jan. 6. Wages in the lumber woods of New PEACE RIVER ROAD Brunswick have taken a big drop this year. The prevailing rate of pay at this time is sixty dollars per month with board, whereas last year it was seventy-five or eighty dollars per month.
