GOLD FLOWING INTO THE UNITED STATES

Great Britain Ships Largest Amount, but France Comes Second

NEW YORK, April 25.—Gold appears to be flowing into the United States from all quarters of the world, especially Europe.

According to the Federal Reserve Board's figures \$28,795,000 was imported in the ten days ended March 20 and \$133,000,000 between January 1 and March 30.

Since March 20 shipments of over \$22,000,000 have been reported as en route and arrived. Thus the total imports since January are over \$155,000,000.

The bulk of the shipments are from Great Britain, but France makes a close second. The board's figures give \$13,588,000 as from London between Jan. 1 and March 20 and \$37,060,000 as from Paris.

By continental divisions Europe accounts to date for nearly \$112,000,000, North America for \$14,090,000, including \$10,000,000 from Canada, South America for \$5,300,000 and Asia for nearly \$22,000,000.
