## U.S. CONGRESS AND CANADA

Number of Bills Relating to This  
Country Up At Special  
Session.

WASHINGTON, April 11.—A number of measures of interest to Canada are slated to come before the special session of Congress called by President Harding for April 11. In the list are the emergency tariff bill of unhappy memory and the bill to restrict immigration to the United States. Both of these bills were passed at the last session of Congress and both were vetoed by Mr. Wilson, among his final official acts as President.

### Emergency Tariff

The emergency tariff measure, known as the Fordney bill, was designed to place so high a tariff on farm products entering the United States that such products would be virtually excluded altogether. The view taken by its promoters, or rather the view announced by them, was that this would be an effective measure of protection for the farmers of the United States. Opponents of the bill, and their name was legion, declared that the measure would never become law, but was merely a political dodge to enlist the sympathy of the agricultural population for the new Republican

administration. These opponents said that it was only another plan to exploit the farmer politically, tried and true tactics employed on innumerable occasions by legislators of all time.

The Fordney bill had a lively time in both houses of Congress and ran the gauntlet of every tariff theory in Washington. It became considerably amended before its final passage, but still retained the feature to which Canadian farmers objected most, a duty of forty cents a bushel on wheat.

### Young Bill

In its new incarnation the bill will be known as the Young bill, being named after Representative Young, Republican, North Dakota, chairman of the sub-committee which is to present it. Despite a flood of requests from senators, representatives, business concerns and farmers' organizations for elimination of some clauses and addition of others, the measure is to be presented to Congress exactly as it stood when it finally passed early in March only to be vetoed by President Wilson.

One of the many requests for new features in the bill came from the flour millers of the United States, who asked for a compensatory duty on flour. The Underwood law imposed a duty of ten cents a bushel on wheat and the compensatory duty on flour was 45 cents a barrel, being ten cents a bushel on the four and one half bushels necessary to make a barrel of flour. In this case the millers asked for a special duty on flour that would meet the duty paid on a sufficient number of bushels of wheat to make a barrel of flour.

**Anti-Dumping.**  
It has been agreed upon by the leaders of the Congress, and approved by President Harding, that anti-dumping legislation will be brought in early in the special session. It is possible that the anti-dumping bill will be incorporated in the emergency tariff measure and that the operation of the latter will be restricted to

a period of six months, within which time it is expected that permanent tariff legislation will have been completed.

The immigration bill that was vetoed by President Wilson just at the close of his consulship will be brought in at the special session in the same form as formerly passed by Congress. Republican leaders have announced. It will provide for limitation of immigration into the United States on a percentage basis, and there is little likelihood that the plan for absolute cessation of immigration for a certain period will be revived.

### American Valuation.

Tariff matters will play a large part in the work of the session, in addition to the features already mentioned. Hearings on the permanent tariff will be carried on, and there is a measure in prospect for adopting American valuation as a basis of customs duties on imported products. Tax revision, a live issue at the present time, will be undertaken, although the form it will assume has not as yet been determined. The old movement to adopt a budget system of financing government expenditures is to be revived.

### General Measures.

Bills of general public interest that will await a chance to sift through include those for the re-appointment of the house membership, packer control, protection of maternity and infancy, soldier relief, education, reclassification of government jobs and reorganization of government departments. Some effort is expected to amend the Volstead law in the hope of making it more drastic.

Those familiar with the legislative program as mapped out say the calendar will not be cleared by late summer, at which time they are counting on a recess or adjournment until December.

### MAITLAND DIES.

VANCOUVER, April 11.—R. R. Maitland, barrister, formerly a clergyman of this city, died this forenoon after a long illness. Death was caused by cancer.
