**Pioneering on the Shores of Francois and Ootsa**  
By the Editor.

The country around Francois and Ootsa lakes is said by many to be the garden of British Columbia. Much of the soil is a rich black loam and it is not heavily timbered, in fact there are open bits of prairie here and there which grow excellent native grass. I did not visit Ootsa Lake because the road was impassable for automobiles south of Grassy Plains. We drove as far as John Bostrom's place on the shore of Lake Tetalaska, and the country not only looked fertile but was extremely picturesque. We were told that Ootsa Lake farther south if so we can quite understand people going back as far as sixty miles from a railway station in order to secure some of the land.

John Bostrom has a fine house on a farm of 1,100 acres with about 200 head of cattle. He raises beef but like all other settlers in that part of the country thinks they should have a creamery and should all go in for dairying. It is essentially a dairying country.

**Experimental Work.**  
One of the valuable additions to the Francois Lake settlement is Dr. Gaine, a veterinary surgeon, who was for nineteen years veterinarian to Nebraska Experimental Station. He has something over 300 acres sloping to the shore of the lake with 100 acres cleared and is doing a good deal of experimenting. He believes that clover crops can be grown there successfully and is trying it out. His son is a graduate of an agricultural college and together they are setting out to make a real home while farming scientifically.

There is a fine farming settlement along the shore of Francois Lake but nothing like what it will be very soon. The lake is something like sixty miles long and with an average width of two miles. There are also numerous other lakes, some fairly large and others very small, scattered over the country, adding to its beauty and utility.

**Roads and Schools.**  
Caring for this large area of country, providing roads and bridges and school accommodation is a big order. People of the south cannot understand why so much money is needed in the north, but when they realize that many settlements are entirely cut off from the outside because even a light wagon cannot pass over the roads without being mired in bad weather, they should see the need of large road appropriations. There must also be larger representation in the legislature for the north so that the influence of this new country may be increased.

**Presbyterian Hospital.**  
In the south the people expect the very finest hospital accommodation for their sick. Let me tell you how they manage in the north. On the fourth shore of Francois Lake is a log shanty that is used as a hospital. It is kept up by the Presbyterian Church of Canada through the efforts of the Women's Missionary Society. It is particularly for the benefit of women who find it impossible to secure necessary aid at the time of childbirth.

There is, however, a small men's ward. Over this institution Miss Kendry presides with Miss Brown and Miss Whitehead as assistants. They have a small boy to help them with the chores but nothing more. At this hospital it is impossible to secure a supply of new milk, the matron states, so evaporated milk has to be used. The hospital is on the shore of the lake, but the ladies have no boat nor any other means of conveyance in order that they may visit their neighbors. The hospital is seventeen miles from Burns Lake and they need badly a cow, a boat, and some poultry. They get plenty of reading matter but the difficulty is the lack of association with the neighbors. The distances are too great.

Mr. Williams, who was of our party, having been vice-president of the Prince Rupert hospital board, took a keen interest in this institution and as a result new life is likely to be put into the hospital. The hospital is badly needed, and it should not be starved.
