

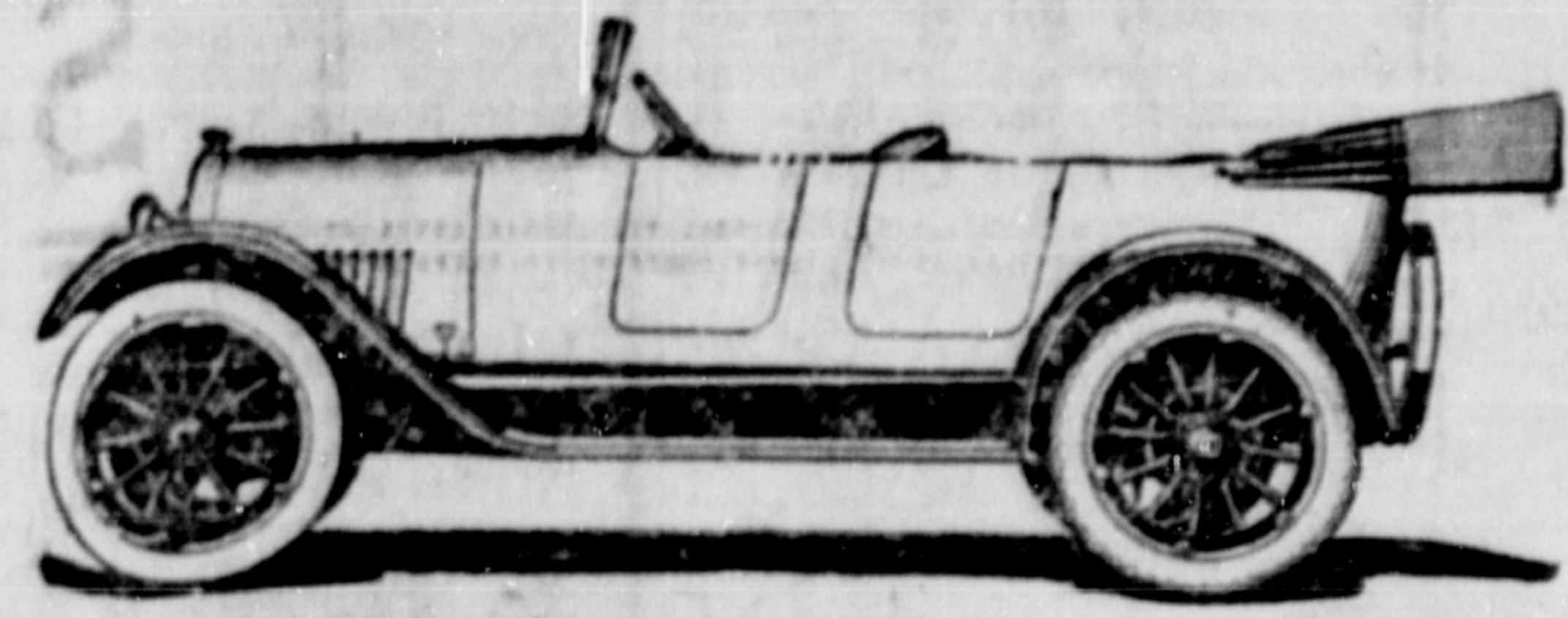

MUSICAL STORY WILL BE SHOWN AT WESTHOLME

"Humoresque," Adapter From Fanny Hurst's Book—Laughter and Pathos.

"Humoresque," the feature at the Westholme Theatre tonight is one of the really big pictures of the season. It cannot be described with justice to it in print for to appreciate it one must see it.

Fannie Hurst, one of America's leading short story writers, wrote the story from which "Humoresque" has been adapted. It first appeared in the Cosmopolitan Magazine and has had a great run since being put into print.

It has been given a remarkable production on the screen. Seldom do motion picture players submerge themselves so completely and with such rare sympathy into the characters they portray as has been done in "Humoresque." Alma Rubens is the featured player and she is supported by an excellent cast.

PRINTING PRESSES MAY BE REPLACED BY SMALL MACHINES

Photography May Revolutionize Production of Magazines and Newspapers.

LONDON, June 15.—Suggestion that printing from type is likely to be superseded was made by William Gamble at the recent World's Congress of Printers held here in connection with the International Printing and Allied Trades exhibition to develop a photographic process to take the place of printing from type.

He predicted that the machines for printing by photographic process would hardly occupy more space than a typewriter nor be any more complicated.

He expressed the opinion that eventually the great printing presses in newspaper offices would give place to smaller, swift-running and comparatively noiseless machines which would turn out printed matter with almost the same facility as the moving picture operator reels off his film.

BROKE RECORD FOR DRINKING OF WINE

PARIS, June 15.—The world's wine drinking record has been broken. At a dinner offered by the Alsatian Wine Growers to the French Minister of Agriculture, 139 varieties of beverages were served.

There were 400 guests and they drank steadily for two hours, snatching only a mouthful of food at rare intervals, while a veritable army of waiters passed the cobwebbed bottles which were brought to the tables by means of a specially constructed toy railroad encircling the hall.
