A letter from Col. Peck, M. P., expressing appreciation for the support by the city of his measure to divide the province was read and filed at last night's council meeting. 11

The city is to put in a 10 inch water main on McBride Street from Third Avenue to First Avenue to provide water supply for the new court house and the fish packing houses at the Government wharf. The work will cost \$1,800. 11

A letter from the Canadian Good Roads Association was referred by the city council last night to the city solicitor and board of works for their information. The convention of the association will be held this year at Halifax and the membership fee for the city would be \$100. 11

The printing of the tax demands for the city will be done this year by A. O. Franks. Tenders for the 1,500 notices in triplicate and bound in book form were received from two firms: A. O. Franks, \$159.30; Melbae Bros., \$174.50. The lowest tender was accepted last night by the council. 11

Tenders for the supply of 500 feet of galvanized pipe, 1 1/2 inch, were last night referred to the Board of Works with a view to splitting the order as the two lowest tenders submitted the same price. The tenders were as follows: Smith & Mallett, \$167.50; Steen & Longwill, \$167.50; Prince Rupert Supply Co., \$175. 11

Tenders for the supply of 450 100-candle power lamps for street lighting purposes were received by the city council last night and a tender of Parkin & Ward was accepted. Four firms, Pattinson & Ling, Canadian General Electric, Northern Electric and Parkin & Ward offered bids, the price being the same in each case, \$513 less 44 per cent. The two former companies bid, f.o.b. Vancouver, while the two latter bid f.o.b. Prince Rupert so the lowest local tender was accepted. 11

A circular letter from Premier Oliver with the information that at the fall session of the legislature municipal questions would be dealt with, was referred by the city council last night to the finance committee with power to act. The latter asked what date would be suitable for any municipal legislation that might be passed to come into effect. Mayor Rochester remarked that January 1, 1922, would seem the logical date. 11
