## WAS WEDDED IN ENGLAND

H. S. Wallace Married Miss Joyce Parnell in St. Clements Danes, London.

When H. S. Wallace returned on Sunday night from a three months' trip to the Old Country he brought with him his bride, formerly Miss Joyce Parnell, daughter of J. W. Parnell, of Southsea, England, to whom he was married at St. Clements Danes, London, on January 22. The news came as a pleasant and complete surprise to Mr. Wallace's many friends here who since his arrival have been keeping him busy receiving congratulations.

The honeymoon was spent at Torquay and Paignton, Devonshire, among the beautiful hills of that district and the return across the Atlantic was made on the Adriatic, heavy storms being encountered en route with reports of several foundering ships. Two days were spent in New York and one day in Montreal, from which city they came direct to Prince Rupert. They have taken up their residence in the Wallace Block.

During his absence of a little over three months, Mr. Wallace went across to France and visited the battlefields of the Great War, saw the devastation that had been made by the fighting armies and the battlements and war machinery. Among the points in France and Belgium he visited were Paris, Verdun, Chateau Thierry, Rheims, St. Mihiel and Brussels.

### BIG GALE BROKE ALL WINDOWS IN LINZEY'S STORE LAST NIGHT

Considerable damage was done about the city in last night's gale which raged at its height about 1:30 at as high a velocity as 40 miles an hour.

The worst sufferer in the gale, however, was the Linzey Grocery at the corner of Fulton Street and Sixth Avenue where all the plate glass windows were blown in and considerable damage done to the stock when the torrent of rain swept right in through the broken windows.

### WOMEN EXPRESS SOME POLITICAL PRINCIPLES

#### In View of Likely Dominion Election in Near Future, Council Acts.

VICTORIA, Feb. 22.—In view of the possibility of an early election, the Council of Women here has been considering certain political principles which have been crystallized and endorsed by a meeting of representatives of women's organizations in this city. The following are the political views as expressed by them:

- Equal moral standards in public and private life.
- Abolition of patronage.
- Publication of amounts subscribed to party funds.
- Open nomination of political candidates.
- Political equality for men and women.

That those who shall hereafter be added to the electorate shall have a speaking knowledge of English or French.

The naturalization of women independently of the nationality of husband.

The practice of thrift in administration of public affairs.
