**SUFFRAGE IN
DUTCH INDIA**

AMSTERDAM, Feb. 22.—Wom-
en's suffrage movements have
reached the Dutch East Indies, the

wherein the "Wild Man of Bor-
neo" and "The Terrible Dyaks,
Feroocious Head Hunting Canni-
bals," drew many times while the
