GOLD DUST SHIPPED FROM ALASKAN PORTS

Nome Is Point Through Which Most of It Goes to World.

SEATTLE, 23.—A total of \$1,273,065 in gold dust and bullion was shipped from Seward peninsula through the port of Nome, according to a statement of commercial business for that port during the season of navigation of 1921. This is slightly in excess of gold dust and bullion shipments from Nome for the navigation season of \$1,190,952.30 was shipped.

Other Slight Decreases.

Statistics obtained in the statement of other commodity movements show slight decreases in virtually all other shipments, coal being the exception. There was a decrease of 1,096 tons in general merchandise received from United States ports during 1920. Coal imports from United States ports, however, increased 1,345 tons in 1921. Reindeer meat shipped during the past season fell below 1920 shipments 151,885 pounds, while there was also a small decrease in shipments of canned and mild cured salmon with correspondingly small increases in salted and fresh frozen salmon, all of which was shipped from the south mouth of the Yukon river.

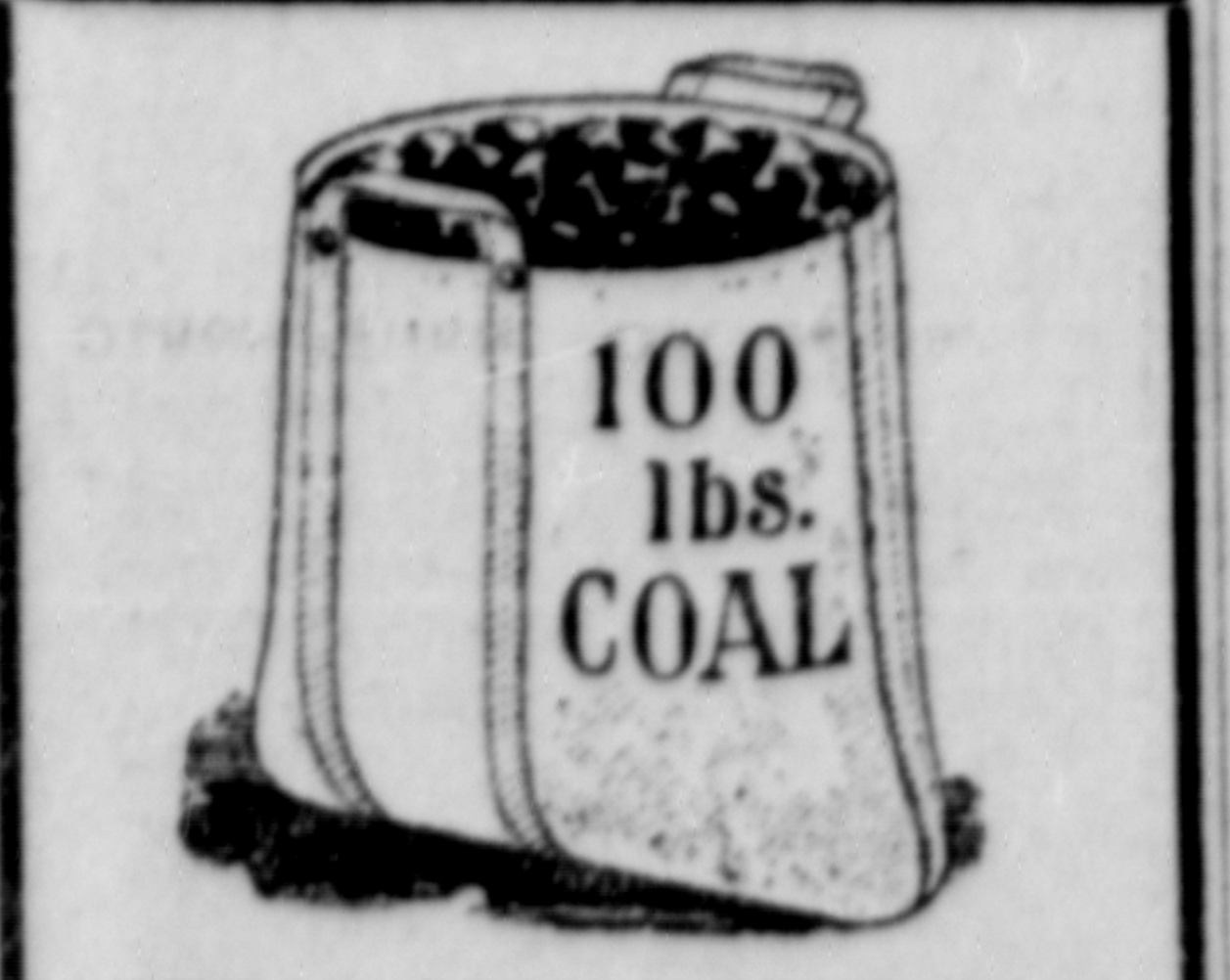

PRINCE GEORGE

J. D. McArthur, president of the J. D. McArthur Construction Company, of Winnipeg, and the man who built the E. D. & B. C. Railway in Alberta, is visiting Prince George. Recently J. D. McArthur purchased the timber holdings of the Spragues of Winnipeg, located on the Mud River, and comprising about 83 miles of fine fir. This timber was staked in the year 1907 by Harold Sprague and Jack Ames of Winnipeg. It is the intention of the McArthur interests to take out a large quantity of ties this winter, and a considerable quantity of saw timber also. A mill is to be constructed at the mouth of the Mud river, to be ready for operation in the spring and the timber will be floated down the Mud River on the spring freshets.

Rev. Father Wolfe, O.M.I., has left Prince George for the coast. Father Wolfe is taking up the work of his church elsewhere, and his loss to the community will be deeply felt by his many local friends.

A meeting was recently held in the City Hall to discuss the erection of a war memorial in order that plans could be formulated to provide a fitting memorial to the Prince George men who fell in the Great War.
