### MOTOR VESSEL ON SLAVE LAKE WAS WRECKED

Northern Trading Company's  
"Speed" Dragned Anchor and  
Driven Ashore.

EDMONTON, Dec. 23.—Word has reached the head office of the Northern Trading Company in Edmonton to the effect that their motor vessel, the "Speed," was driven ashore on the beach of Great Slave lake during a violent storm.

The vessel was under the command of A. C. Woodman, and was on a voyage—the last of the season—from Fort Smith to Wrigley harbor on the Mackenzie, but on reaching the big lake ran into one of the terrific storms which have been common in the north this fall. For two days the little ship battled against the elements but with her engines opened to the fullest extent she was unable to make any headway, was gradually driven back towards the shore line.

In addition to using her engines anchors were used, but the combination was not sufficient to hold her against the storm and she was finally driven up on the beach a mile from Fort Resolution. Despite her buffeting, the boat did not suffer any considerable damage, her propeller shaft and wheel were damaged, but otherwise she is sound.

#### Haul By Oxen.

Arrangements have been made with the Catholic mission at Fort Resolution to haul the boat over to the channel leading to the Slave river with teams of oxen during the winter, and she will be launched in good time in the spring.

The damaged machinery is being repaired, and no time will be lost when navigation opens, as the vessel will be in the open waters of the Slave river, and back to Fort Smith long before the ice is broken on Great Slave lake.

Though the northern body of water is notorious for its sudden violent storms these have been unusually violent during the late fall; the speed of the wind is described as being terrific and as the lake is shallow a very high sea runs in consequence. In addition to this thick fogs have been prevalent and navigation of the lake has been more hazardous than usual.

### SONS AND DAUGHTERS OF ENGLAND CHRISTMAS TREE HELD YESTERDAY

The Sons and Daughters of England held their Christmas tree festival for the children in the McIntyre Hall yesterday afternoon. Over one hundred children were present and a real good rollicking time was spent. Tea was served from 4:30 to 6 o'clock when Santa Claus suddenly appeared and started in to shake hands and make the acquaintance of the kiddies, such to their delight. The gifts from the giant tree were then distributed.

The presents were taken from the tree by Mrs. Cox, and handed to Mrs. Woods, President of the Daughters of England Society, who in turn handed them to Santa Claus. Santa Claus gave each gift to the lucky recipient individually. Although here were such a large number of children present nearly all received presents. At the conclusion of the gift giving the president of the Sons of England asked for any child to come forward who had not received a gift and it was found only one child had been left out. This little mishap was soon rectified and a present was forthcoming right away. With each present went a bag containing oranges, candies and nuts.

At the conclusion of the festivities the president called for three cheers for Santa Claus which was lustily responded to by the youngsters and in the midst of it Santa Claus made a hasty departure. The entire arrangements for the tree were carried out by the Daughters of England Society.
