**BRINGING UP FATHER****NO MORE GAMBLING  
IN SOUTHERN CHINA****PROPERTY OWNERS  
ON COMOX AVENUE**

List of Those Who are Interested in That Section Submitted to Police Commission.

PEKING, Feb. 11.—Gambling is being severely discouraged in Canton, according to consular dispatches from there. General Ch'en Ch'ung-ming, acting civil governor of Kwangtung, has issued regulations making it an offence punishable by death or 20 to 2 years imprisonment to engage in gambling as a profession, to maintain a gambling house or to protect the maintenance of such a place.

A list of the owners, agreement holders and occupiers of Comox Avenue property, prepared and certified correctly by Sergeant William Adams, was submitted last night to the police commission. A list of suspected houses nearby was also appended.

There was considerable discussion on the report and it was pointed out that the principal owners of improved property on Comox Avenue were Chinamen and one in particular was mentioned, Chen Ying. In many cases rents, which are considered excessive by the police commission, were being charged.

"Some of the owners who pose under the mask of respectability are worse than pimps," stated Commissioner Macdonald.

"It does not smell good to me of any resident of this city buying property in that section during the last eleven years. I would favor the taking of any action possible that would show we resent it. It is not the girls that I want to get after, but it is those who are renting them property at such rates. I think we could get assistance from them in proving our cases and I would favor the pushing of this matter to the limit."

The report has been submitted to the city solicitor with a view to taking legal action against owners.
