Charmier for the breakfast room is a set of olive green with a drop leaf table, serving table and Windsor chairs.

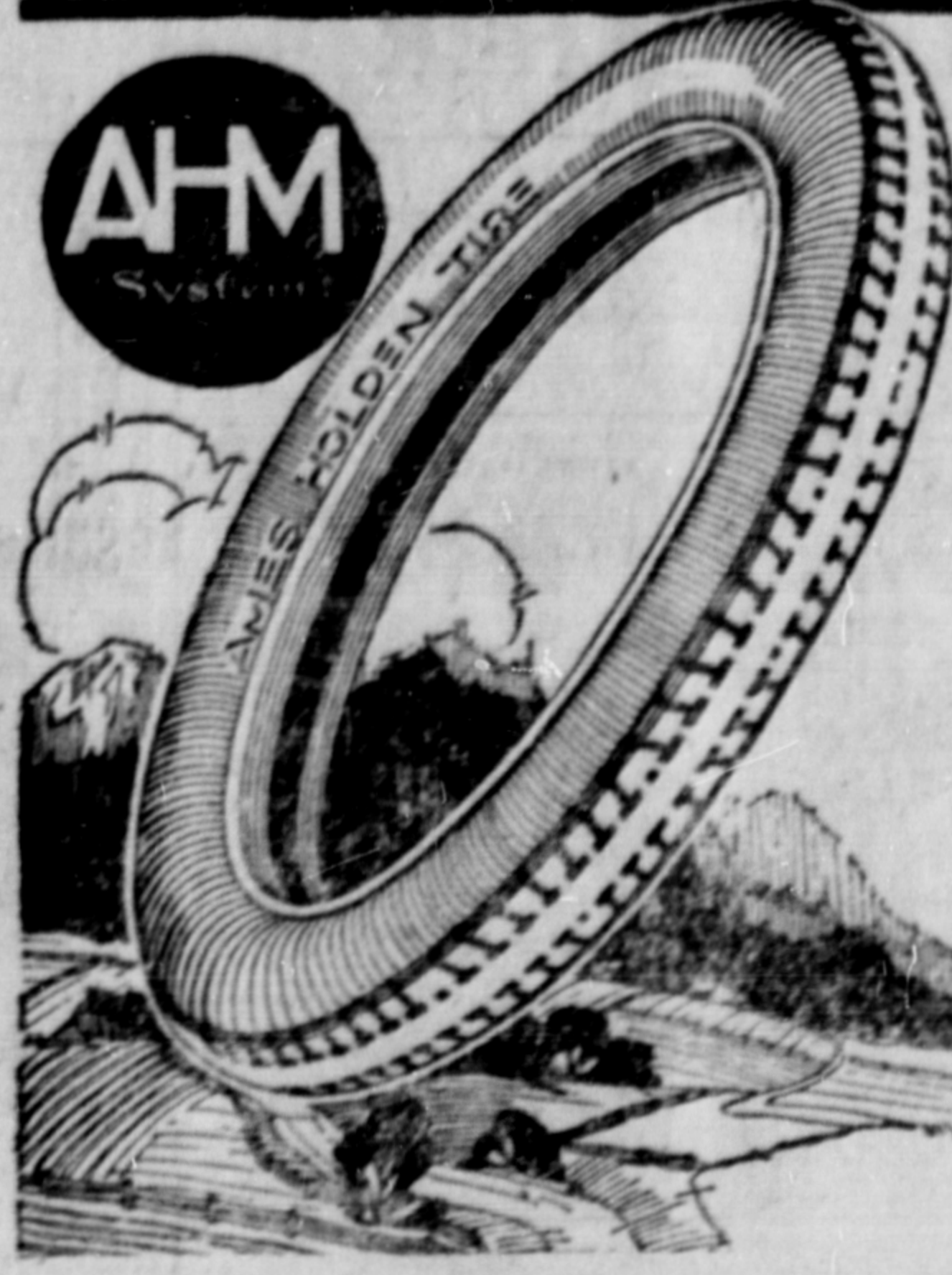

Average Not as High as Usual Owing to Prevalence of Malady.

The daily average attendance was 612 and the percentage of attendance was 90.25.
