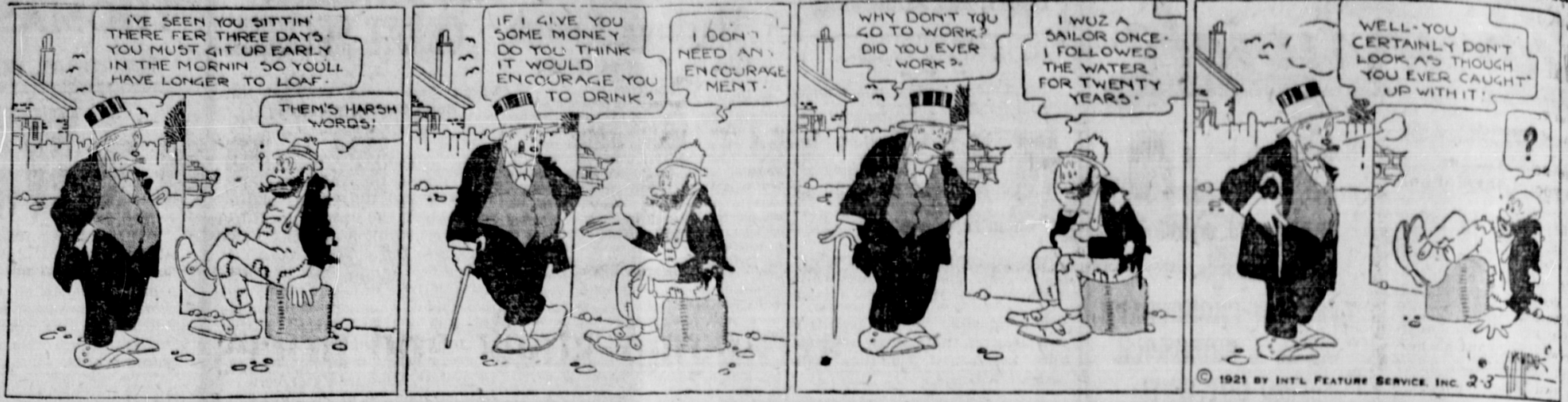

PERRY BOOSTS PRINCE GEORGE

Tells Legislature of Wonderful Riches of Peace River—An Empire.

VICTORIA, Feb. 10.—Both A. N. Mackenzie of Vancouver in moving, and H. C. Perry of Fort George in seconding the address in reply to the speech from the throne in the Legislature yesterday referred to the forthcoming liquor control bill.

The Fort George member gave as his opinion that the Government did not aim to make a profit out of the sale but would sell at as low a price as possible.

Speaking of his district he emphasized its richness and said: "There is an empire in the Peace River with its wealth of coal, oil and farm products that in ten years would liquidate the debt of the P. G. E. Railway and give sufficient tonnage to make it pay. There are 30,000,000 acres of land in the Peace River district, of which 10,000,000 acres can be classed as good land and would yield wheat from 30 to 50 bushels to the acre and oats 70 to 100 bushels.

"Oil seepages were abundant and the Imperial Oil Co. had staked big claims in B. C. recently. He urged assistance to get settlers.
