**FISH LUNCHEON GREAT SUCCESS**

Large Attendance at Affair at Hotel Central Yesterday Afternoon  
One of the best attended and most interesting luncheons ever held in Prince Rupert was that of yesterday at the Hotel Central for the purpose of celebrating Canada's Fish Day. There was a fine spread provided by Peter and Mrs. Black entirely of fish products and the tables were crowded, something near two hundred sitting down to the sumptuous banquet.  
The address of the day was delivered by Thomas McClymont on the development of the local fishing industry. At the conclusion he was thanked on a motion proposed by John Dybhavn and seconded by George Frizzell.  
Mayor Speaks  
Mayor Rochester presided and spoke on the origin of Fish Day on the suggestion of Mr. Paulos of the Fisheries Association. He said the fisheries of the port meant everything to the businessmen. It was the staple product. It meant the same to Prince Rupert as the wheat crop did to the prairies. They ate, talked and thought fish. There had been difficulties in regard to transportation, but, through the efforts of Colonel Peck and others, this was being overcome. He then read a telegram from President Hanna denying that there was any intention of taking the big steamers off this route.  
The luncheon opened with the singing of "Oh Canada" by a prominent fisherman, John Davie, everyone joining in the chorus, and closed with the National Anthem.

**SAYS BAYVIEW HAS GOOD ORE SHOWING**

L. Russell of Stewart Proposes Considerable Activity at Mining Camp in Summer.  
L. Russell, who is connected with the Bayview mining property and who is here en route south, says that there has been some good ore shown on this property. It is galena running from fifteen inches to four feet in width. There has not yet been enough work done there to thoroughly test the continuity of the ore veins, but as far as they have gone it looks as if the property was valuable, for the ore is rich. There are a large number of claims in the group which lies between the Bear River and the international boundary.  
Mr. Russell thinks there will be a lot of activity at Stewart this coming year, not only on the Salmon and Bear rivers, but also on the Marmol.
