TAXI ROBBERY CASE BEFORE JUDGE YOUNG

Yesterday Afternoon and Today Spent in Taking Evidence on Both Sides.

The J. R. Rudland taxi robbery case was proceeded with before Judge Young in the county court yesterday afternoon and this morning when evidence for the prosecution and the defence was taken. The case was adjourned until this afternoon when further evidence will be heard.

J. Petrin, from whom the money is alleged to have been stolen, Dominick Mara, steward in the Citizen's Club, L. Lazzar, bartender in the Royal Hotel, and Constables McGlinch and Macdonald were the witnesses for the prosecution. E. Marshall, taxi driver, Bentley Tate, Joe West and the accused were the witnesses for the defence. The accused stated that he had only made one run on the night in question, that being to the Marine Ironworks with Joe West, who substantiated this statement. The bills which had been found in the shoe of the accused had been placed there at Christmas time when he had changed them for smaller bills with J. Harris, a restaurant man, who is to be put on the stand this afternoon.


