LONDON, Dec. 14.—The Admiralty has cancelled the decree preventing east-bound passenger vessels entering Queenstown. The decree was promulgated to prevent the landing of arms in Ireland from the United States.

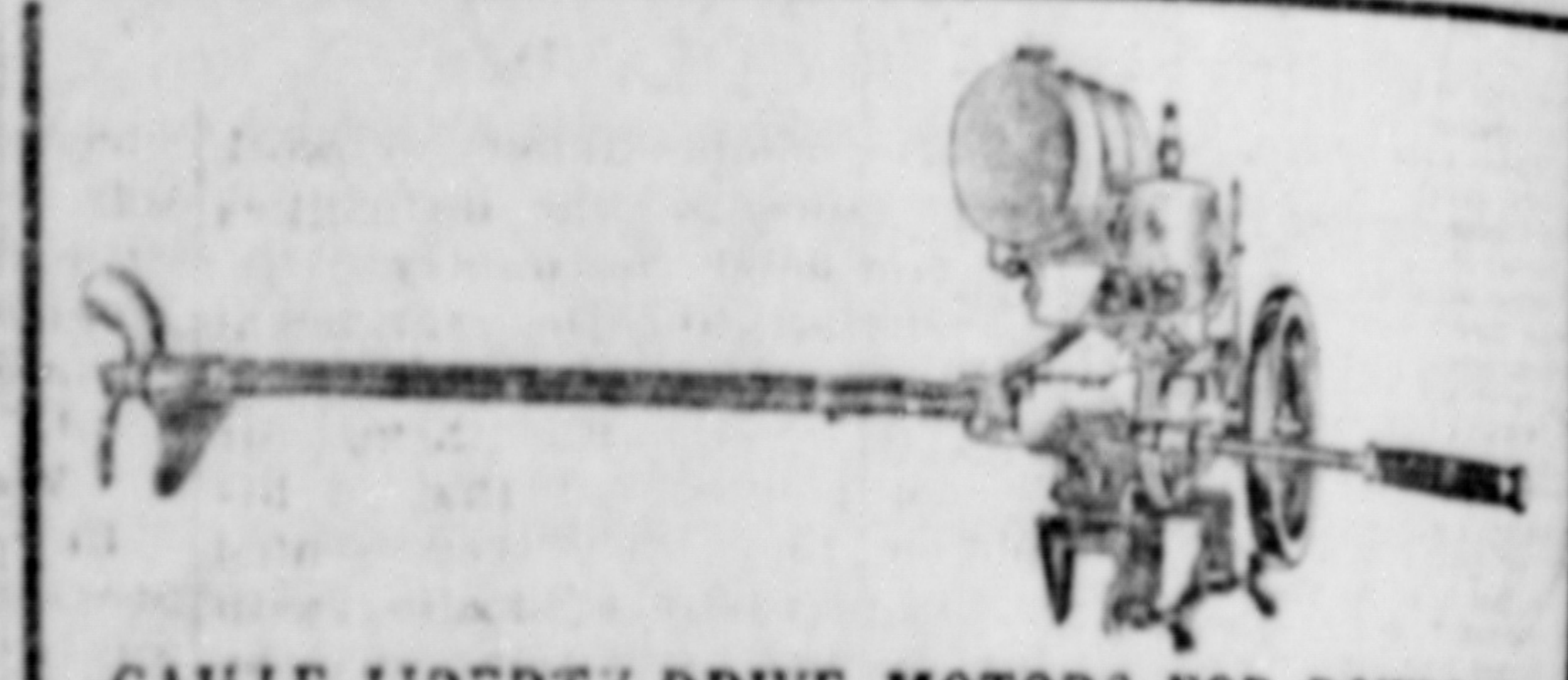
