## MINNIE PARKER IS COMMITTED FOR TRIAL

Notorious "Bath House" Figures  
in Another Police Court Case  
This Morning

The notorious "bath house" on  
Fulton Street figured in another  
police court case this morning  
when Minnie Parker appeared  
charged with theft and selling  
liquor. On the former charge  
she accused has been committed  
for trial and on the latter she was  
dismissed.

According to the evidence of the  
principal witness for the crown,  
H. Peverelle, in the theft case, he  
went up to the "bath house" on  
night several months ago with \$95  
in his pocket. He was asked by  
the accused for a loan of \$25 to  
pay her rent and then was taken  
to stairs and bought drinks of  
whiskey which cost \$20. The  
liquor had a powerful effect and  
the accused is alleged to have  
put her hand in Peverelle's pocket  
and removed the remaining \$50.  
He was then taken to a chop suey  
house and left in a box. The  
evidence for the defence was not  
given in the preliminary hearing.  
A. Wengland gave evidence of a  
corroborative nature.

W. E. Williams, of Williams,

the accused.

## BIG HALIBUT BOAT IS COMPLETE LOSS

Zilla May, Well Known Here,  
Wrecked on Strait Island Reef  
Last Thursday

The well known fishing schooner  
Zilla May, which has made fre-  
quent calls at this port, was  
totally wrecked last Thursday  
when she ran on Strait Island  
Reef, the same point where, in  
1917, the American coaster Mari-  
posa met her fate. Captain Hans  
Aarvold and his crew of thirteen  
men were rescued from the wreck  
and are now on their way to  
Seattle.
