3.C. Municipalities Plead Danger of Going Broke if No Help from Government

VICTORIA, March 22.-Unless given immediate financial retief many of the larger cities and towns of British Colombia will be in the hands of receivers before they can obtain their share of the liquor profits, the municipal committee of the Legislature was told by the executive of the Union of B. C. Municipalities esterday. The delegation urged a tax of five cents a day on all workers, \$15 a year on others, and \$15 on all corporations to bay the cost of schools and hospitals.

The committee was asked to bring the whole question of unicipal finance before the Legislature in order that it might eceive full consideration.
