## MORE HALIBUT SELLS TODAY

About 180,000 Pounds Was Handled at Fish Exchange This Morning.

There was a decided increase of halibut arrivals at the Fish Exchange this morning when 180,000 pounds were marketed. The price for the first class fish was about the 15c mark.

The following were the arrivals and sales:

Tatoosh, 20,000 pounds and Florence, 5,000 pounds, sold to the Booth Fisheries Canadian Co. at 15c and 7c.

Chancellor, 14,000 pounds; Eagle, 6,000 pounds and Rainier, 5,000 pounds sold to the Pacific Fisheries at 15.1c and 7c.

Brothers, 16,000 pounds; Bringgold, 6,000 pounds, and Scub, 2,000 pounds, sold to the Pacific Fisheries at 15.3c and 7c.

Senator, 20,000 pounds; Eagle 3,000 pounds, and Scout, 2,500 pounds, sold to the Sinclair Fisheries at 14.5c and 6c.
