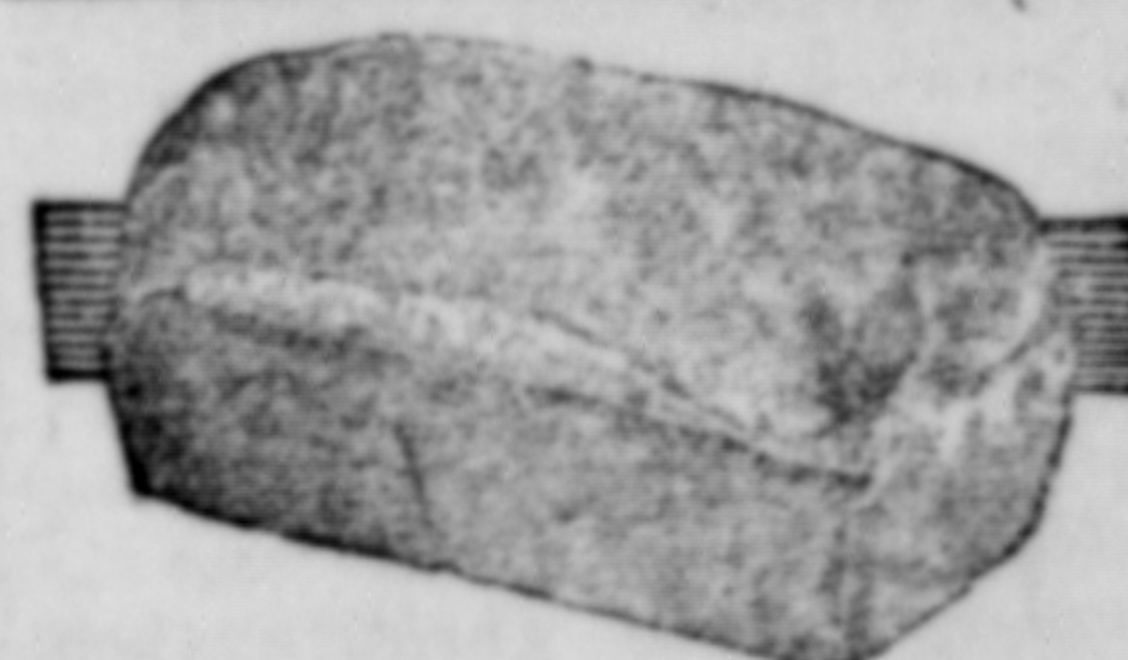
Mr. and Mrs. M. B. Scott arrived in the city on Saturday from Ketchikan and are registered at the Hotel Prince Rupert.
