Reginald McKenna Urges Cancellation of Debts Owed Allies by Germany

CHICAGO, Oct. 26 .- Reginald McKenna, ex-Chancellor of the British Exchequer, stated at a public dinner here that he believed the payment of German reparations was only possible by cheap German production with unfair competition for British exports and consequent unemployment in Britain.

Mr. McKenna said he personally favored the cancelling of the debt of ten billion dollars Germany owes Britain and even the six billions owed by the Allies and Dominions to Britain, permitting the British people to produce wealth rather than take the dribble of wealth from Germany. The speaker suggested the same thing was true in a lesser degree of the ten billions Germany owes the United States.
