BOSTON, Oct. 25.—An ocean race between Bluenose, the Canadian yesterday won the sailing championship of the North Atlantic and the Mayflower, sailing out of Boston, is being mooted here.

The Mayflower, after being nominated the American defender, was debarred from the international competition as not being within the required specifications.

# PEERS ARE CRITICAL GOVERNMENT ACTION

Lord Sydenham Declared British Rule in India Weakening and Will End Shortly. LONDON, Oct. 26.—Despite Lord Curzon's appeal that a debate be avoided on the eve of the Prince of Wales' departure for India, the opposition peers insisted on introduction of criticism of the Government policy in India where the British administration was said to be weakening daily. Baron Sydenham declared British Government shortly will end in India.
