Sport Chat

S. D. Macdonald, president of the St. Andrew's Society, states officially that the reason for the Gallies, the representatives of the society, not being entered in the Basketball League this winter is that it was absolutely impossible for the club to rally together for a team in either the intermediate or the Senior competitions. A strenuous effort was made to this end but it failed with little success so it was finally decided that it would be better to have no team at all than one that could have no chance of winning. It is true that some of the Gallies' players had already enlisted with other aggregations but it was not because the society was disgruntled at that no team was entered. Notices were posted calling for prospective players and only four responded. The Gallies, Mr. Macdonald says, are just as much behind basketball this season as ever, even if they have no teams entered.

Babe Ruth! Much has been written about him and there is much yet to write. But of all the stories of Ruth perhaps the most interesting developed this fall when the Yankees and the Indians were in a death grapple for the American League flag. Babe was putting forth his greatest efforts and 99 out of every 100 fans thought the Bambino was doing the superhuman because it meant world series coin. That was far from the truth. The Babe was doing it because he wanted the glory of the World Series and he wanted his club mates, and his employers and the fans of New York to enjoy the same glory. When Babe entered the Cleveland series and the two teams were in a deadlock for top honors the Babe realized full well that if his team won and eventually advanced to the World Series he would lose \$50,000 in cold coin. That represented the difference in World Series money and what the Babe had already been offered for his post-season services.

All know that there is a rule in organized baseball that the members of a club participating in a World Series are barred from exhibitions, barnstorming trips, etc., during the period between seasons. That hit Babe Ruth smack between the eyes. He had \$25,000 worth of engagements with semi-pro clubs in the East alone. Then there was a trip to Cuba and a demand for his services in the winter league on the Pacific Coast. Participation in the 1921 World Series would mean perhaps \$5,000. That was the situation which Ruth faced. He knew and realized perhaps better than anyone else what it would mean for New York to win. Did he let up on his stick work? He did not and his heavy hitting was a feature of the Cleveland series when he might have eased up and avoided post-season difficulties with Judge Landis which he had recently. The Babe cannot be said to be a quitter for he has always given the best he had. He is already predicting that he will set a new home run record in 1922. When his present contract with the Yankees expires he will probably be offered a much larger figure.

MR. SPEAKER BRINGS BOWSER TO TIME IN REGARD TO MOTION

A motion made by W. J. Bowser in the Legislature was ruled out of order by Speaker Manson. It had to do with the administration of the moderation act and made charges against members of the Government. In form it would, if passed, have committed the House to the condemnation of acts which it had not been proved had been committed. Mr. Manson read a statement explaining why he had refused to have the notice of motion on the orders of the day and suggesting means by which a proper motion could be brought forward.


Young Preacher
