



OPTIMISTIC OVER RUPERT

Kenneth Ferguson of Victoria Tells About This Place in South

"I was never more optimistic about Prince Rupert's future than I am today," declared Kenneth Ferguson, the well-known Victoria manager of the Imperial Life Assurance Company, according to the Victoria Colonist.

The people of Prince Rupert display a highly creditable and highly encouraging spirit of optimism, stated Mr. Ferguson. While they were not making any large capital outlays at the present time, they were quite evidently prepared to move ahead with the Northern development which was due in the not far distant future.

The shipyard is employing in the neighborhood of six hundred men at the present time, said Mr. Ferguson, who pointed out that in a few months the work on the Government ships would be completed and added that it would be a great pity if the fine plant could not be kept busy.

Plans are going ahead for a sulphite mill at Prince Rupert. The fishing industry was hampered at the present time by lack of proper ears.

There is an acute shortage of housing accommodation at the present time in the Northern city, and there is an extensive travel between the South and Prince Rupert. The high price of material has held back building activities, but this work will go ahead just as soon as costs come down, he declared.

Mr. Ferguson claimed that the spirit prevailing in Prince Rupert was the same as existed elsewhere throughout the Province. He believed the worst of conditions to be past, and that British Columbia is upon the threshold of a new forward movement.

WINNIPEG TRYING TO POPULARIZE BONSPIEL BY SHORTENING TIME

WINNIPEG, Man., May 7.—The Manitoba Curling Association has under consideration a plan to curtail the annual bonspiel to one week in an effort to revive the popularity of the big event and ensure a greater yearly attendance from outside points. At the recent annual meeting of the association here it was pointed out that whereas the association was steadily increasing in size, no commensurate increase was being recorded in the attendance at the bonspiel.

Various speakers, particularly from country points, indicated that the paucity of entries from outside was immediately traceable to the fact that the bonspiel was too long. Under the plan now being considered play would commence on a Monday, with city rinks only involved in the first two draws in order to permit outsiders to reach the city. With four draws a day, it is believed the spel could easily be finished by the following Saturday.

DELAY EXCURSION TO LATER IN SEASON

Board of Trade Propose Visiting Bulkley Valley in August; Pictures for B. C. House.

A report from H. F. Pullen, chairman of the publicity committee of the Board of Trade, at the meeting of the board last night recommended that the matter of an excursion to the Bulkley Valley be taken up in July with a view to running the excursion in August. It was pointed out that if a rate of a fare and a third could be obtained, the cost of the trip, including sleepers, would be about \$25 for each person, provided fifty made the trip. The report was adopted.

PROSPECTORS' POWDER REBATE

Twenty-five per cent Allowed on Retail Price if Used for Mining

The local member, Mr. Pattullo, has received a letter from Hon. William Sloan, minister of mines, enclosing regulations governing rebates to be allowed bona fide mineral prospectors on the cost of powder used in developing mineral claims in British Columbia.

A rebate is to be allowed of 25 per cent on the retail cost of such powder on amounts up to ten cases of powder in one year, and on the written recommendation of a resident engineer of the department the amount on which a rebate is allowed may be increased under exceptional circumstances.

Applications for rebate must be signed before a mining recorder, justice of the peace, deputy mining recorder, or resident engineer of the department of mines power to act.
