OVER MILLION DOLLARS SPENT BUILDING HERE

Not Including Big Contract Value for Year Totals \$617,653.

The total value of building permits issued by the City of Prince Rupert for the year ending December 31, 1921 was \$617,653. This includes \$400,000 for the new provincial court house but not the new station, costing \$40,000 and the new dock costing well into \$1,000,000 both under construction now. All together, it will be seen, would bring the total value far over the million mark.

Total permits for 1920 was \$406,649.50 which included the new \$180,000 public school.

The comparisons of the figures with last year's total shows an increase of permits issued this year of \$211,003.

LONDON WANTS HIGHER STORES

LONDON, Dec. 31.—A serious effort is being made to secure higher buildings, particularly higher stores, in London. It rests upon a belief that only by doing so can adequate service to the shopping public in the central districts be maintained. In the next five years comprehensive rebuilding must be undertaken in Regent Street, Piccadilly Circus, Oxford Circus and High Street, Kensington. To the question, "What is to take the place of the present insufficient accommodation?" the answer is given in some quarters that, if the restrictions now adopted are continued the new buildings will soon be out-of-date and unable to meet the public needs. Large West End and other London stores, which find themselves cramped by these restrictions, are asking permission to erect buildings to a height of 120 feet from the street to the top floor, and, where sites face open squares, parks, or river, to a limit of 150 feet, provided lighting is not affected.

The Victorian Limit.

At present the height of buildings in London is limited to 80 feet above the street level. Such restriction was necessary under the methods of building employed during the Victorian era, with the risk of fire that they involved. The contention is that modern construction with steel and concrete has quite changed the conditions, commercial blocks and departmental stores of recent erection being, for all practical purposes, fireproof. Unable to go higher, some proprietors have developed the basement system. In one case a new store has been taken down to the level of the Bakerloo tube, but the expense is great, and there are other disadvantages. In domestic architecture also, American methods are likely to have increasing influence. The Royal Institute of British Architects has just held an exhibition of photographs and drawings of examples of American buildings. The exhibition showed the gradual expansion and development from the early work of the Colonial period—illustrated by some of the unknown architects in Virginia and Massachusetts and the early work of the Western States with its Spanish origin still clearly marked—to the work of masters such as Richardson, Burnham, Hunt, Post, and McKim, and their successors.

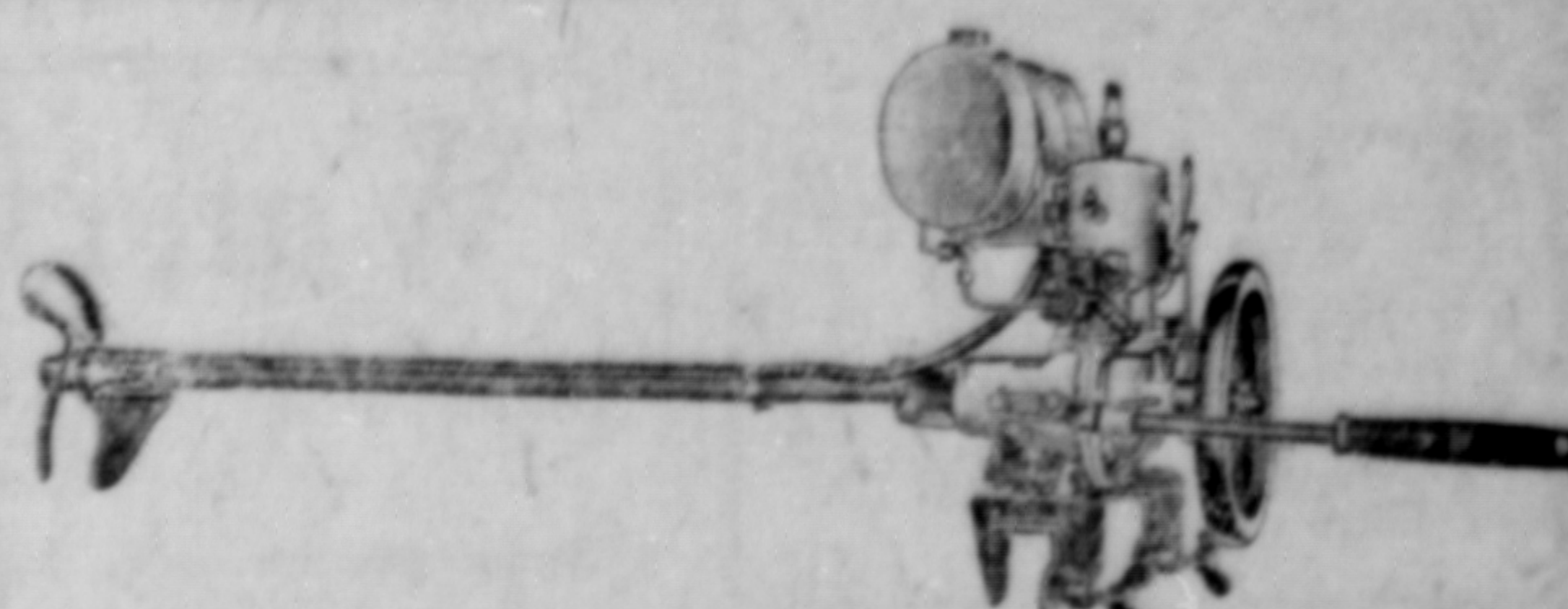
