SUPERFLUOUS WOMEN SIMPLY AN ILLUSION

Members of Weaker Sex Able to Do Almost Any Work Done by Men.

In her presidential address to the National Council of Women at Sheffield, Lady Selborne discussed the question of "superfluous women." She said women did not regard the situation seriously. At present the single woman with no one dependent on her could earn her living more easily than her brother. They were very far from the point at which they could truly speak of any able-bodied woman as superfluous. Her services were wanted in a great many other capacities than those of wife and mother. We did not lack mothers. Women were taking a large part in elementary education, and the Civil Service, it was hoped, would prove attractive to many able women.

Mental Equipment.
Women were not exactly like men in their mental equipment. The old notion that some activities were suitable to men and some to women was true; but the conventions of the last few centuries had made it absurd. To say that women, by their nature, were fit for such hard work as scrubbing and laundry work and unfit to be clerks, compositors, officials, or jewelers was obviously untrue. These conventions took their use in an age when education was much rarer among women than among men, and had been maintained by men who were afraid of women's competition lowering their own wages. Women of exceptional ability should not be prevented from rising to the highest posts in their trade or profession on account of their sex. Liberty would give both sexes the chance of choosing the work for which they were best fitted by nature.

HAUNTED HOUSE IS SPRINKLED BY PRIEST

Crowds Gather to See Place Said to Be Troubled by Spirits.

MONTREAL, Oct. 20.—Hundreds assembled Saturday, Sunday and Monday at the house alleged to be haunted, located at 77 Cazalais Street, St. Henri, and the police were forced to post extra constables at the door in order to prevent entry by the curious. Many came from country districts, and the police state that they have never before seen so many automobiles stationed in the district.

Rev. Father Dorval, Vicar of the parish of St. Elizabeth, in which the house is located, blessed every room in it on Sunday.

Further, he made inquiries and ascertained that fortune tellers had formerly occupied a part of the house and had predicted, by means of cards, that terrifying happenings would take place there. The cards were still in the house, and the Rev. Father tore them up and flung them in the fire.

Since his visit it is stated that everything is now normal at 77 Cazalais street.
