LORDS DISCUSS DOG SMUGGLING BY PLANE

LONDON, April 21. — Dog smuggling by airplane has arrested the interest of the House of Lords, which recently devoted part of an afternoon to a discussion of the subject.

The pampered toy-dog was roundly execrated by a number of their lordships. Lord Willoughby de Broke supporting Lord Beddslow in a demand that "such useless brutes" be excluded from the country.

It was pointed out that it was an easy task for a person to smuggle the small lap dog into the country in a muff or basket.

The Ministry of Agriculture promised to renew its vigilance in the matter of preventing dog-smuggling and to increase the penalties if necessary.
