 several months from various
 places.

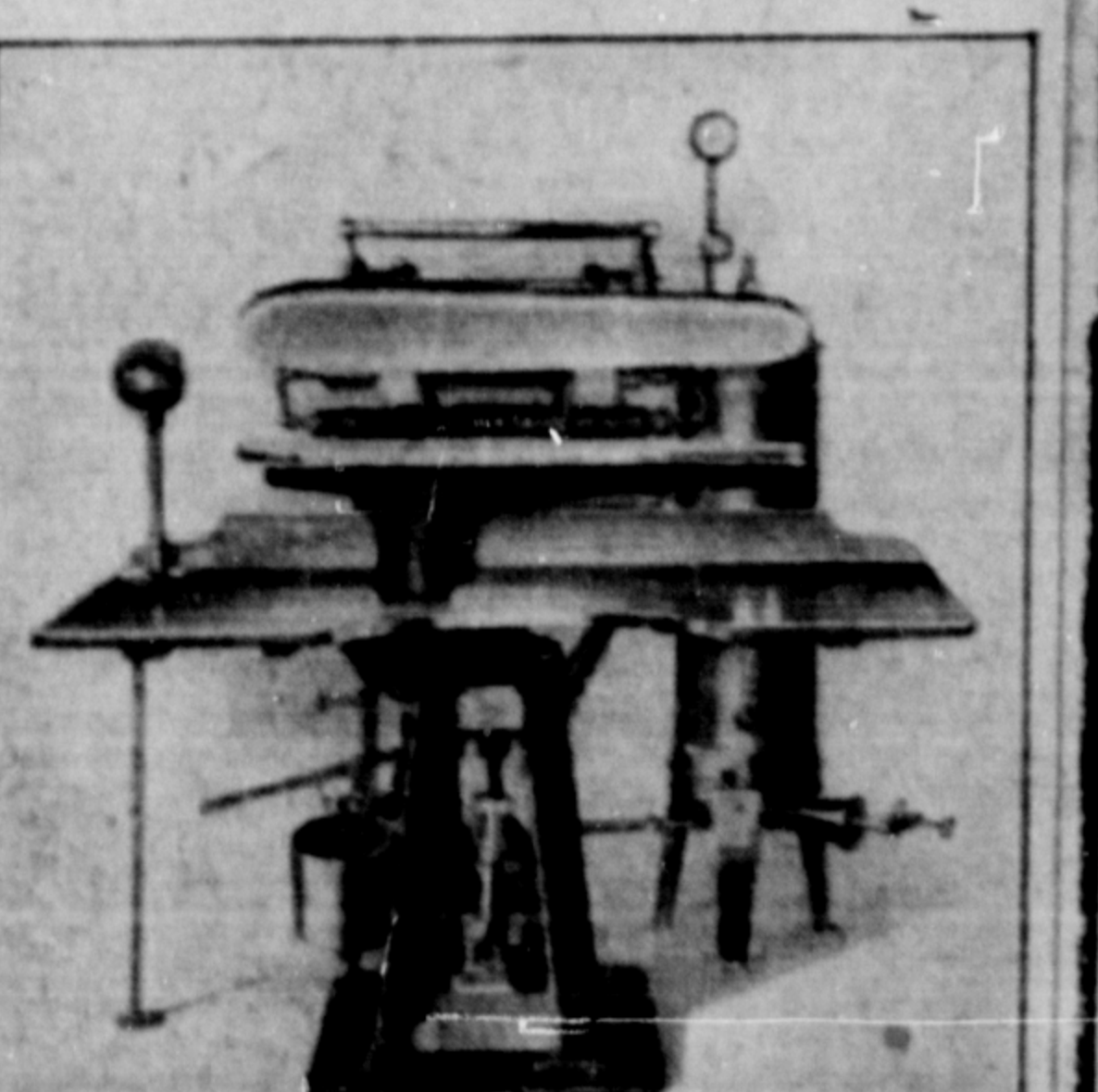
