PROSPEROUS TOWN REDUCED TO THREE

KETCHIKAN, Jan. 24.—Tumbling down and falling to ruin, the town of Hadley, once a flourishing mining community of five hundred, now houses but three inhabitants, according to report brought here by five Ketchikan men who returned from a business trip to the old town yesterday.

Scores of oldtimers in Ketchikan once participated in the activities of the once prosperous and live community. It is now dead, the board streets collapsing, and many of the houses gradually tumbling to ruin.

The large fifty thousand dollar hotel still stands; the store is now being torn down by "Hank" Roselle and Arthur Propp, the present owners. With Lou Crane, who has been at Hadley for some time tearing down the building, and G. A. Richards and Jess Finck, they returned here a few days ago.
