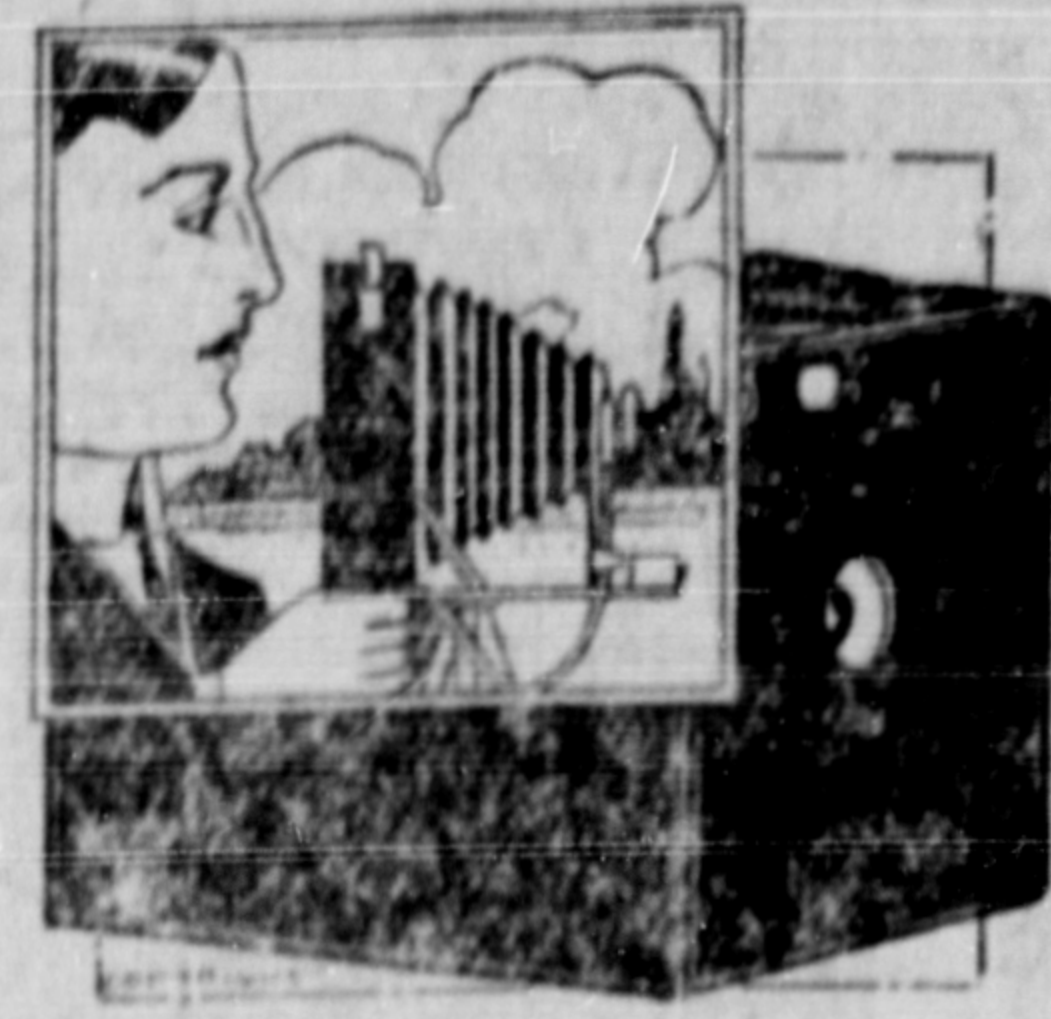

RUPERT ROAD IS DISCUSSED

Engineer Carruthers Returns from Convention of District Officials at Victoria.

A. L. Carruthers, who returned yesterday from Victoria, attended while there the annual meeting of district engineers of the province at which Mr. Carruthers himself read a paper on "The Weakness of the Outside Organization." There were a number of very helpful papers and discussions in regard to public works as it applied to the provincial department. The engineers were entertained by Dr. King, minister of public works, at his residence and the deputy minister and several members of the Legislature were also present.
While in the capital Mr. Carruthers discussed with Hon. T. D. Pattullo, Dr. King and the deputy minister of public works, the various public works proposals for the district, including the construction of a road from Prince Rupert to Galloway Rapids on Kaiten Island. Nothing definite in connection with this will be decided until the estimates are brought down. Mr. Carruthers found both ministers keenly interested in the road, the only difficulty being the problem of finding the money for the work.
Mr. Carruthers mentions incidentally that in the event of the road being built it would be necessary for the city to build a piece of road connecting with it at the end of Shawatlans Ave.

TAKE NOTICE that Granby Consolidated Mining, Smelting & Power Co. Ltd., whose address is Anxox, B. C., will apply for a licence for the storage of five million gallons of water out of the east branch of Hidden Creek which flows southerly and drains into Hidden creek, about two-thirds of a mile from Granby Bay.
The storage-dam will be located 200 feet from the east boundary of lot 2224. The capacity of the reservoir to be created is about five million gallons, and it will flood several acres of land.
