Johnny Kilbane, the 32 year old champion of the featherweights, is so well preserved in his old age and the crop of featherweight contenders is so mediocre that the Cleveland veteran likely will realize his ambition of being king of his division for a period of ten years. The time is up next February 22 when he will celebrate the tenth anniversary of his victory over Abe Attell, the once famous featherweight. Since then there hasn't been any particularly good talent for Kilbane and he has fought everything offered. Danny Frusch was considered the best of the bunch and was set against Kilbane this fall. Some of the fans thought that Kilbane had gone back and would be beaten but he proved he hadn't gone back very far. Now Johnny Dundee threatens to get down to weight and revive an old Italian-irish feud. If he can make the weight and revive handily he will probably give Kilbane a better argument than any of the regular featherweights of today. In 1913 Kilbane fought for the title. The Italian fought a whirlwind serap against Johnny and it went the full twenty rounds and was called a draw. It was one of the hardest fights Kilbane ever was in.

In the fight with Frusch, Kilbane used a right hook to the jaw that first sent Danny down in the third round. The same blow put him down again in the sixth and in the seventh the first knockdown was scored with the same punch. The second knockdown in the seventh was from a series of both right and left handed blows, Frusch having no defence and being battered down again for the count of nine. He arose and laid back against the ropes with his arms down when Kilbane used everything he had to send him down the last time. The right hook to the jaw was really the knockout blow.

BEER QUESTION TO COME BEFORE THE LEGISLATURE SOON

VICTORIA, Oct. 27.—Premier Oliver promised a delegation of brewers on Saturday that their requests regarding the sale of beer by the glass in hotels and regular eating places would be

placed before the Legislature at an early date.

A. B. Macdonald, K.C., who appeared as counsel for the delegation, pointed out that 80 per cent. of the space in the government liquor stores was being used for handling beer and that the overhead cost of administration could be cut in half if the stores did not have to carry beer. Premier Oliver said that the passing of the Liquor Control Act had been the work of the members of the Legislature and that any amendments to the act would have to be brought about after a careful consideration of the matter on the floor of the House. It is expected that Attorney-General Farris will introduce a bill shortly to provide for the opening of the act. This will afford a full opportunity to the members to discuss the beer question.
