### FORESTRY BOAT HAD EXPLOSION

**Leila R. Now Lies Sunk at Seal Cove Marine Ways.**

The forestry boat Leila R. was sunk yesterday morning at the Seal Cove Marine Ways as a result of fire originating from an explosion of a gasoline tank on the launch. Four workmen were engaged on the boat and were within a few hours of completing the annual overhaul of the craft when the explosion occurred. Shortly afterwards she would have again been in the service of the provincial government and ready for the season's work.

The crew were busy at work when the explosion occurred and seem to be at a loss to know what actually caused it. There was no inflammable material on the vessel outside of the gasoline in the tanks which were securely screwed up. There were two men working inside the boat and two outside when the tank exploded. One man, Temple, was thrown into the water and the clothes of a second, Campbell, caught fire and he jumped into the water. The other two were also stunned but fortunately none were injured severely.

### RETURNED SOLDIERS MEET WITH SUCCESS

**N. M. & R. Fish Co. Doing Well At Herring Bait Business.**

James Neville, of the N. M. & R. Fish Co., the returned soldier company which started operating some months ago in the fishing industry, backed by the Dominion Government, reached town at the week-end with the rest of the crew and the company's two boats, the "N. M. R." and the "N. M. R. No. 1."

Mr. Neville reports that so far this season they have met with success beyond their expectations and despite heavy expenses will clear good wages and make decided headway in consolidating the affairs of their company from a financial standpoint.

Their business consists at present not of halibut fishing, but seine fishing for herring to supply the halibut fishermen with the very necessary bait. In the past the obtaining of bait has been a decided difficulty. As the business prospers and they acquire more capital the N. M. & R. Co. will enlarge their traps for keeping the live herring on hand, and the company doubtless will become one of the most important concerns in these northern waters. After a short period in Prince Rupert taking a well earned holiday and attending to sundry business matters, the two boats and outfit will go south to Estevan Island, where operations will be carried on for the rest of the summer.
