LOCAL GREEKS SEND CASH TO AID WOUNDED

Check went OFF Today to Hellenic Red Cross at Athens

Today there was sent to the Hellenic Red Cross Society of Athens a check for the sum of \$250 from the Greek community of Prince Rupert to help care for the wounded in the war now in progress between the Greeks and the Turkish Nationalists.

A few days ago some of the local Greeks got together and raised the money and purchased a draft for the value in Greek money. The sum of 2943 drachmas was sent.

The Greeks here say they feel rather strongly in regard to the manner in which the little nation is being left to fight this war itself, none of the allies aiding in any way except Britain.

The outcome of the fight is being watched carefully and with great interest, and naturally the local people think the Greek Army is sure to be victorious.
