## NO FEAR FROM HIGH TARIFFS

SO Says New York Times to Canadians; Bill a Big Joke

NEW YORK, Feb. 3.—The Fordney tariff bill, the ostensible aim of which is to protect farm products of the United States by placing a prohibitive tariff on similar products of other countries, is not to be taken seriously by Canadians, according to the New York Times. In quoting some editorials from Canadian papers, in which trade "reprisals" were threatened should Congress adopt the Fordney bill, the Times asks: "Can't the Canadians take a joke?"

"Could there be a more delicious joke," the newspaper continues, "than a tariff of 45 cents a bushel on imported corn? The country produces some 3,000,000,000 bushels a year. In 1918 we exported 49,000,000 bushels and imported 5,000,000. If importation were prohibited the American price would be changed by a shadowy fraction too small to see.

### Lemons and Peanuts

"For the benefit of a little band of California lemon growers the rate on lemons is jacked up 150 per cent. Everybody uses lemons. A few people raise them. The greatest good of the smallest number is a sacred principle. Let us do something for the poor peanut grower, said the sages of Washington. So they give him a little tariff boost of only 325 per cent; and he gets it," says Representative Bull of Tennessee.

"In the face of the statistical fact that the combined import and domestic production of peanuts leaves a deficiency for domestic consumption of 220,000,000 pounds for the years 1919-20, when compared with the preceding year." Friends of farm pro-

ducts not included in the bill have watched it with jealous eyes. Why have they no portion of this government pay? So amendments for their benefit, extending the saying blessings of protection to about everything raised on the farm have been slapped on the bill in committee.

### Simply for Farmers

"These amendments are but infants to the fully grown additions which its opponents are to impose on it. The Immigration bill and the Soldiers' Bonus bill, affecting Germans, are the least of these. Senator Harrison of Mississippi will give an endurance test. The Little bill for the re-education of the federal statutes will have to be recited in all its majestic length. In that ocean of 3,000,000 words the protection ark will be sunk. Some inextinguishable cynics and 'free traders' threaten to dump the treaty of Versailles on that laboring craft.

"The bill wasn't meant to be passed. It is merely an evidence of good faith to the farmers. It is intended to reconcile them to being bled for the benefit of the manufacturers by the tariff law to be framed by the next Congress according to the immortal principles of Dingley, Paine, William D. Kelley and Aldrich."
