**CHURCH PROPERTY TAXATION DISCUSSED**

VICTORIA, July 30.—If it should lose its present suit against the Catholic Bishop of Vancouver Island—a case which involves the right of British Columbia cities to tax church lands—the city of Victoria will endeavor to secure legislation which will fully establish its right to levy taxes on churches.

The civic authorities are determined not to abandon the fight for church taxation. If the Privy Council decides that the present law does not give B. C. cities power to tax churches it is hoped that laws giving the city this power will be passed.

**CANCELLATION OF FISHING PRIVILEGES**

Possibility of Similar Action Being Taken Against Americans.

OTTAWA, July 30.—The Government is considering the situation following the cancellation of war time privileges to Canadian fishing vessels for trade into United States ports on equal terms with Americans. United States fishermen still have the privilege of using Canadian ports and this probably will be cancelled by Canada.
