### FEED SALMON ON OWN EGGS

Local Fisheries Office Institutes New Departure in Propagation of Fry.

The local Dominion Fisheries office has received instructions from the Department at Ottawa to prepare for the carrying of 100,000 pounds of salmon eggs from the canneries of the Skeena River to the Canadian Fish and Cold Storage plant here. The spawn will be placed in cold storage and later, probably about February, will be taken to the Babine and Lakelse hatcheries and there used for feeding the small salmon in course of development.

### CITY COUNCIL AND ANGLLO-JAP TREATY

Wants Dominion to Regulate the Matter of Immigration for Themselves.

In reply to a letter received from the Vancouver city council touching on the matter of the proposed renewal by Great Britain of the treaty with Japan, the Prince Rupert city council last night warmly endorsed the action taken by Vancouver in informing Premier Meighen that it was undesirable that the Dominion of Canada approve of the renewal of the treaty unless a distinct proviso is clearly made that, where any of the Overseas Dominions are concerned, the regulation of the admission of orientals be left to the Dominions themselves. The city clerk was instructed to wire the Dominion government to this effect.

### INVITATION FIRE CHIEF TO GO TO CONVENTION

A letter has been received by the city council inviting the Fire Chief to visit Three Rivers, Quebec, to attend the Thirteenth annual convention of Fire Chiefs, to be held in that city on August 9, 10, 11 and 12. It was pointed out that the expenses incurred by the city in connection with sending the Fire Chief to the convention would be more than made up by the amount of knowledge and information that it would be possible for the chief to acquire through the gathering of the Fire Chiefs and the demonstrations given in the latest methods of handling fires. The matter was referred to the Utilities committee with power to act.

### SALMON PACKING WILL LIKELY BE FINISHED EARLY

The salmon packing season this year will likely end with the closing of the sockeye fishing on August 21. Then the most of the canneries will close after having operated a little less than two months.

The only circumstances by which the season would be extended after August 31 when usually the pack of humps, dog salmon and cohoes is carried on, would be a sudden movement of the large stocks of pinks that are on hand, and with which the market at the present time appears to be glutted.

### FARMERS' INSTITUTE STARTED AT OSLAND

Incorporation of Society at Icelandic Settlement Has Been Gazetted.

A Farmers' Institute has been established at Osland, Smith Island, and the B. C. Gazette carries notice of its incorporation under the Societies Act.

The objects of the Institute are as follows:

To improve conditions of rural life so that settlement may be permanent and prosperous.

To promote the theory and practice of agriculture by lectures, essays, the circulation of information, and other educational methods, and to stimulate interest by exhibitions, prizes, and other means.

On behalf of its members to arrange for the purchase, distribution, or sale of commodities, supplies, or products, and generally to act on their behalf in all matters related to agricultural pursuits.

To promote social intercourse mutual helpfulness, and the diffusion of knowledge, and to make new settlers welcome.

### SEATTLE HALIBUT BUYER SAYS FISH ARE GETTING SMALL

SEATTLE, June 28.—The way the halibut fishery is going is indicated by a statement of one of the Seattle fish buyers who says there was a time not so many years ago when a special effort had to be made to prevent the bringing in of too many "whales," or extra large halibut, from the banks off Vancouver Island, but for the past year or more he has not seen more than 10,000 pounds of "whales" in a fare, while many fares run half or more than half "chickens," and small ones at that.
