Friday, July 15. High—10:40 a.m., 16.0 feet. 22:27 p.m., 19.0 feet. Low—4:35 a.m., 5.6 feet. 16:21 p.m., 9.1 feet.

The time used is Pacific Standard, for the 120th Meridian west. It is counted from 0 to 24 hours, from midnight to midnight.

The table given is for Port Simpson but the time for Prince Rupert varies only a few minutes on some days and on others is the same. The range of the tide may be computed as 5 per cent greater at Prince Rupert than at Port Simpson both at springs and neaps.
