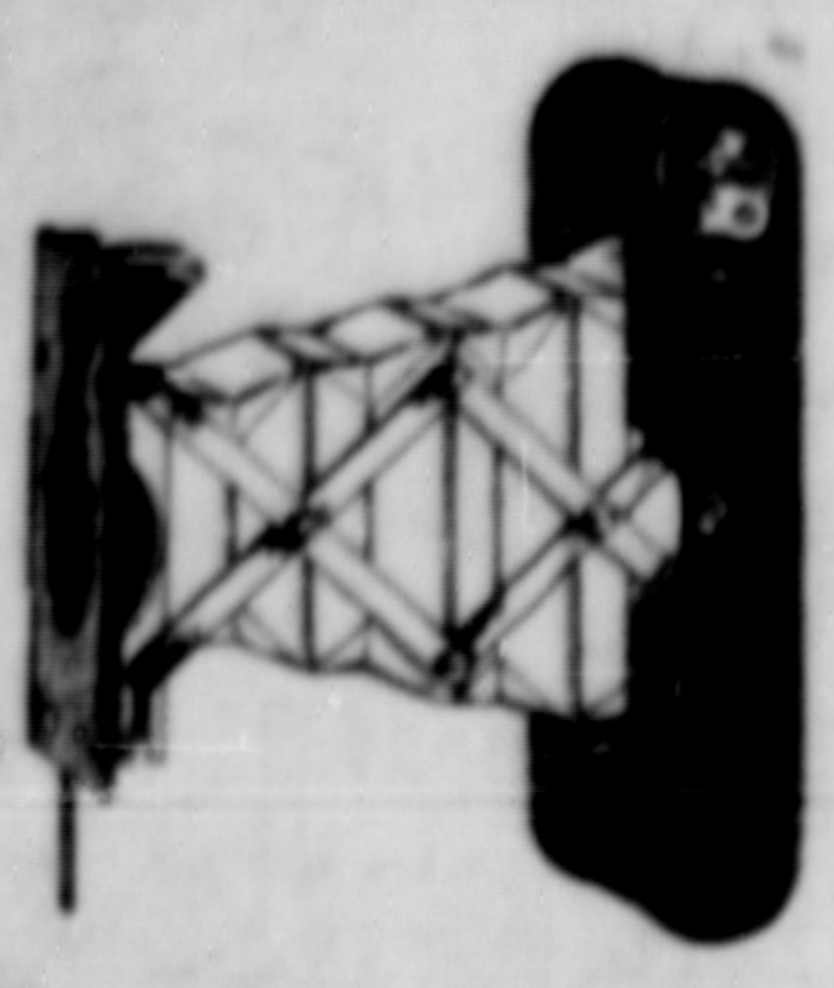

Constable Gibson, of Port Essington, will arrive on tonight's train with two Chinese prisoners to serve sentences at Okalla, one for six months for selling liquor to Indians and the other for three months for having opium in his possession. They will be taken south on Thursday night.

Inspector of Fisheries J. T. C. Williams and J. F. Hutchinson, his assistant, are today visiting the mouth of the Skeena River and will be back tonight or tomorrow. Major J. A. Motherwell, chief inspector, is expected here at any time. The Givenchy on which vessel he left Vancouver, reached this port this morning.

The big lighthouse tender Estevan, Captain Barnes, is at present at Skidegate making repairs and alterations to aid navigation in the waters of that vicinity. This vessel will remain in the north for a fortnight before returning south. The Birnie is at Digby Island today and the Newington is still working out of the Victoria depot.

W. D. McLaughlin, of San Francisco this morning commenced the clearing of his lots on Third Avenue between the Cars Building and the Enad Block where he proposes to erect a two story store and apartment building. If Mr. McLaughlin carries out the present plans of the building it will be one of the most up-to-date and finely equipped structures in the city.

In compliance with the request of the police commission, the city council is to bring in a taxi parking by-law prohibiting the standing of cars on Third Avenue near the junction of Gomon Avenue. Speaking on the request at last night's council meeting the mayor stated that the police commission was powerless to regulate the parking of these cars without a by-law from the council.
