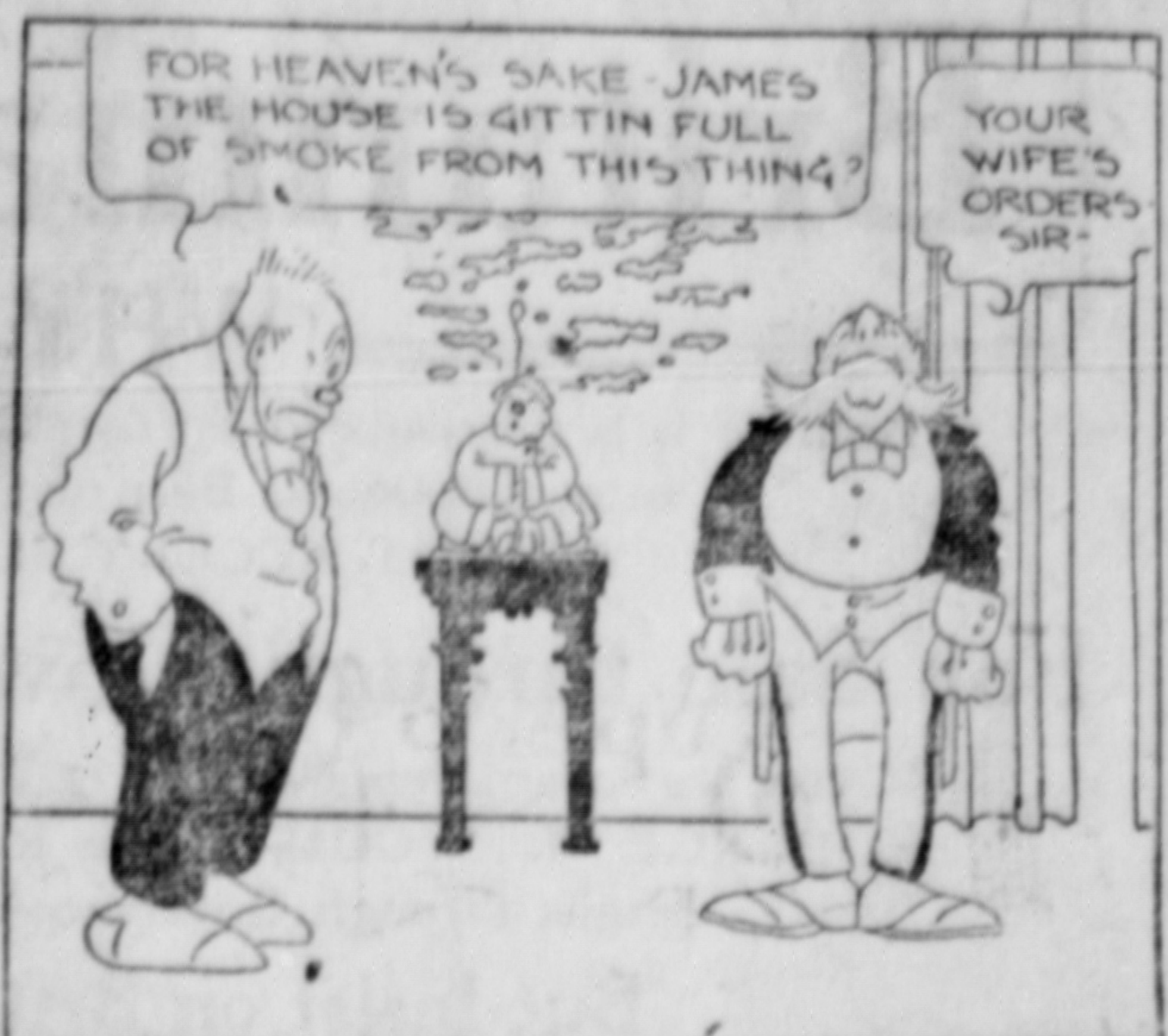

BRITAIN GETS BACK TRADE FROM STATES

Coal Selling at Cardiff at \$5.50 a Ton American Money. LONDON, Nov. 8.—Britain's export coal trade, transferred to the United States a few months ago, owing to the long strike of British mines, is rapidly slipping out of the hands of the American traders, according to a report of Trade figures. "The rapidity with which the international coal trade is returning to British hands is evidenced in the fact that three months ago the United States was actually exporting coal, not only to the Scandinavian countries but to England, with distinct leadership in the Mediterranean and undisturbed primacy in South American markets," said Alfred P. Dennis, commercial attaché of the American Embassy. "We, today, are practically out of the European trade and are rapidly losing our position in the Mediterranean markets, which we had secured practically half the business with our position seriously menaced in South America, where we occupied logically a favored and a positive position."

Amazing Recovery The amazing recovery of the British coal industry is shown in trade figures for August which shows an export business of more than 7,000,000 tons as compared with 4,000,000 tons the preceding month, and 1,817,000 tons in August, 1920. "This striking reversal in the coal situation is due to the immense quickening of coal production in the United Kingdom accompanied by falling wages."

Price Today. "Fine quality Cardiff coal can now be put on shipboard at 30 shillings, equivalent at present exchange rates to about \$5.50 per ton. At normal exchange the price would be \$7.30. "It remains for us to endeavor to maintain our competitive position by bringing down f.o.b. steamer costs, while at the same time indulging the hope that future appreciation of sterling may tend to equalize our position, not only in South America but in the major continental markets."

PLOTTERS ARE SENT TO JAIL FOR TERM; OTHERS ACQUITTED STOCKHOLM, Nov. 8.—Four men involved in a sensational plot for a Bolshevik revolution in Sweden, which was discovered in June, have been sentenced to prison terms of eighteen months and four years. Seven men accused have been acquitted.

NADEN GONE TO PRINCE GEORGE TO NEGOTIATE

Timber Syndicate Discusses with Pattullo Question of Raw Material Supply.

WILL OPERATE PULP MILL

Already Owns Extensive Timber Limits in Interior of Province.

VANCOUVER, Nov. 7.—A conference was held at the week end with Hon. T. D. Pattullo by E. S. Peck of Scranton, Pa., A. Cameron of Ottawa, Angus McLean of Bathurst, N. B., and Robert Tyhurst, of Prince George in regard to the building of a pulp mill at Prince George. They told the minister it was their intention to build a 100 ton mill for immediate operation, to be enlarged later if necessary. The syndicate holds extensive timber limits in the interior, mostly west of Prince George, and they wanted was to come to an agreement with the Government in regard to a suitable continuous operation of the mill. Following the conference it was decided to send George R. Naden, deputy minister of lands, to Prince George to represent the Government in final negotiations for securing sufficient timber limits to provide the necessary raw material for the concern.

COLONEL PECK HELD MEETING

Rally of Supporters in Committee Rooms on Saturday Evening.

Col. C. W. Peck, independent candidate for the forthcoming federal election, addressed a full gathering of his supporters at a rally in the Frizzell Block committee rooms on Saturday evening. He reviewed the situation and again explained his position as an independent candidate, stating that he was tied to no party. He told of his recent trip North and referred to enthusiastic meetings and receptions at Stewart, Anxox, Alice Arm, and Port Simpson. He took to task the visiting politicians who were in the district campaigning for Fred Stork.

H. G. Stewart was the chairman and other speakers were T. Ross McKay, W. G. Dennis, John H. Turnbull and O. B. Nelson. Col. Peck, George Frizzell and O. B. Nelson left on Sunday night by launch for Swahon Bay and Ocean Falls to hold meetings at those places.

ASSASSIN LURKED BEHIND BLACKBOARD AT RAILWAY STATION

TOKIO, Nov. 8.—The assassin who stabbed Premier Hara was lurking behind the station blackboard as the Premier emerged from the station office, where he has been resting following the arrival of the train ten minutes before. The youth darted from behind the shelter and thrust his knife into the Premier's breast close to the heart. Hara collapsed immediately, falling to the floor without a sound. He could not be revived and died within an hour.
